PETITION FOR DECREE PRO CONFESSO

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Petition of Alva F. Rice and Mattie M. Rice, by Glass & Burgee,  
their solicitors, respectfully shows unto your Honors:

FIRST: That on or about the 24th day of April, 1962, your Petitioners  
filed their Bill of Complaint herein and on the same day an order was entered  
herein directing that your Petitioners, by causing a copy of such order to be  
inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, Maryland, once a  
week, in each of four successive weeks, the last of such publications to be  
made not less than thirty days before the 26th day of June, 1962, give notice to

SECOND: That such notice was duly published in The Frederick Post,  
a newspaper published in Frederick County, Maryland, as appears from the

descendants or successors of Jacob P. Hummer, deceased, have failed to  
appear or answer said Bill of Complaint or show cause why a decree ought  
not to be passed as prayed although the time for their appearance and answers
