TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:-

The Petition of Charles B. Wood, judgment creditor of Howard Bevard respectfully represents:-

FIRST: That your Petitioner on the 2d day of September, A. D. 1922, issued an execution on judgment obtained in your Honorable Court being No. 64 Judicials, September Term, 1921, and William Wertenbaker, Sheriff of Frederick County, on the 3d day of September, 1921, in the execution of said writ levied upon and took in execution nine Holstein Cows, four Jersey Cows, one Holstein Bull, one gray Horse and two Roan Mares, which execution represented a debt of Seven Hundred Ten Dollars and Ninety Cents (\$710.90), being the amount of said judgment and Seventy Dollars and Eighty-Three Cents (\$70.83) costs, which judgment and cost have not been paid.

SECOND: That subsequent to said execution, the said Howard Bevard executed a Deed of Trust conveying all of his property including the property so taken in execution to Leslie W. Coblentz and H. Noel Haller, Trustees, who qualified as such and sold among other property the property levied upon as aforesaid, reporting said sales to your Honorable Court on September 12th, 1922, and the Petitioners advised that said Trustees have in hand the proceeds arising from the sale of the property so taken in execution, which is sufficient to satisfy said judgment claim and cost.

THIRD: That Petitioner is advised that said Trustees will not state their account in said cause until after April 1st, 1923, awaiting the settlement for the real estate sold under said Deed of Trust.

FOURTH: That your Petitioner is further advised that he is entitled to have said judgment claim and cost satisfied and the funds paid over to him at this time, said judgment being a first lien on the
