The object of the Supplemental Bill of Complaint filed in the above entitled cause is to procure the sale of two mountain lots at the same time of the sale of the farm containing one hundred acres described in the original bill of complaint; one of the said two mountain lots containing 5 Acres, 3 Roods and 12 Perches of land, having been conveyed to the said John W. Miller by Jacob Mort and Julia Ann Mort, his wife, by deed dated March 11, 1857, and recorded in Liber H.W.B. No. 296, folio \_\_\_\_\_, one of the Land Records of Frederick County; the second of said mountain lots containing 6 Acres, 3 Roods and 18 Perches, more or less, having been conveyed to the said John W. Miller by deed from Andrew J. Wachter and Doctor R. Wachter, Trustees, dated March 30th, 1886, and duly recorded in Liber H.W.B. No. 296, folio \_\_\_\_\_, one of the Land Records of Frederick County.

The Bill in substance states that the parties to this cause are the same parties as set out in the original bill of complaint filed March 17, 1910, and that all of the parties to said bill of complaint and to this supplemental bill of complaint are adults and residents of Frederick County except the children of a deceased son of John W. Miller, as follows: John M. Miller, an adult, Effie Miller and Harvey K. Miller, infants, all residents of Xenia, Montgomery County, Ohio, said infants having in guardian within the jurisdiction of this Court.

The supplemental bill further states that the parties plaintiff and defendant are all the parties in interest; that it is to the benefit and advantage of all the parties
