

TO THE END, THEREFORE,

(1) That a Final Decree may be passed by this Honorable Court foreclosing all rights of redemption of the Defendants in and to the property herein mentioned and described, and that the County Treasurer, Collector of Taxes for the State of Maryland, and the County of Frederick, Maryland, may be directed to prepare and execute a deed to the said Worthington R. Angleberger, Jr., and Alma P. Angleberger, his wife, for the said property, the Complainants herein, and the holders of the Certificate of Sale, in fee simple, upon payment to the Collector of the balance of the purchase price of the property, together with all taxes and interest and penalties thereon accruing subsequent to the date of sale.

And for such other and further relief as the nature of this cause may require.

And may it please your Honors to grant unto these Complainants the writ of subpoena directed to the said defendants in the State of Maryland, and all of the other defendants mentioned as residents of Maryland, and the Order of Publication against any non residents who might have any interest in the property herein mentioned, in the 8-acre parcel mentioned or any part thereof, and all persons having or claiming to have any interest in said property, warning said defendants and all persons having or claiming to have any interest in said property, to be and appear in this Court and answer the Bill of Complaint or to redeem the property on or before a certain day to be named in said subpoenas and Order of Publication, and in case of failure to do so, a final decree will be rendered foreclosing all rights of redemption in said property.


