The object of this proceeding is to secure the foreclosure of all rights of redemption in the following property: Parcel of land containing 8 acres, more or less, in Tuscarora District, Frederick Co., Md., and described in the deed from Sarah E. Haffner, et al., to Edward J. Angleberger, April 16, 1907, recorded in Lib. S.T.H. 278, fol. 596.
