That your Complainant and her Attorneys have made reasonable efforts to ascertain all of the heirs, devisees, personal representatives, descendants or successors in interest of the said Philip C. Fisher, John H. Fisher, Jane E. Fisher, Oscar W. Fisher, Charles W. Fisher, Keefer I. Fisher, and Albert P. Fisher, and have set forth as Defendants the known heirs which the Complainant and her Attorneys have discovered.

That the above matter constitutes a cloud upon the title of your Complainant and although your Complainant claims to hold a valid fee simple title, the same cannot be established of record without the removal of the aforesaid cloud upon the title of your Complainant, that your Complainant have no adequate remedy at all.

It is thereupon this 10<sup>th</sup> day of January, 1968, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, and by the authority thereof, ORDERED that the Complainant, by causing a copy of this Order to be inserted in some newspaper published in said Frederick County, once a week in each of four successive weeks, the last of such publication to be made not less than 30 days <sup>before</sup> ~~from~~ the 19<sup>th</sup> day of March, 1968, give notice to the unknown heirs, devisees, personal representatives, descendants or successors in interest of Philip C. Fisher, John H. Fisher, Jane E. Fisher, Oscar W. Fisher, Charles W. Fisher, Keefer I. Fisher, Albert P. Fisher, deceased, whether residents or nonresidents, of the object and substance of this Bill, ordering them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitors, on or before the 19<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1968, next, to show cause,
