SIXTH: That pursuant to Article 93A, Section 206, of Chapter 4 of the Laws of Maryland of 1969, the appointment of a guardian, as defined in Section 101(d) of that Article, vests in him title to all property of a disabled person, as defined in Section 101(a) of that Article, presently held or thereafter acquired.

WHEREFORE, your Petitioner prays:

(1) That your Honorable Court decree that the said real and personal property be sold at public auction after being advertized in accordance with the Maryland Rules of Procedure, with such sale being subject to confirmation by this Honorable Court.

(2) And for such other and further relief as the nature of the matter may require.
