

A. He was survived by my Mother, Lola A. Dorcus, and the following children: My brother, John C. Dorcus; my brother, Robert L. Dorcus; my sister, JoAnn Dorcus Kehne; my brother, Michael D. Dorcus; and myself, Barbara Dorcus Kreh.

Q. Is your brother Michael living now?

A. No, he is not.

Q. When did he die?

A. He died June 23, 1965.

Q. Did he die testate or intestate?

A. Intestate.

Q. By whom was he survived as his only heirs-at-law?

A. His wife, Janet Rae Poole Dorcus, and his two sons, Steven Dorcus and Andrew Dorcus.

Q. Mrs. Kreh, is your mother, Lola A. Dorcus, living?

A. No, my mother is deceased.

Q. When did she die?

A. December 15, 1968.

Q. Did she die testate or intestate?

A. Testate.

Q. I show you certified copy of Will filed in these proceedings as Exhibit "I". Will you examine the same, and state whether or not that is the Will of your late mother?

A. That's it.

(Exhibit "I" filed with the Examiner in evidence.)

Q. While the Will speaks for itself, Mrs. Kreh, will you state the manner of distribution of Mother's estate?

A. Her estate was divided five ways: To the four living children and to the little boys - the heirs of my deceased brother, Michael. By reason of the minority of Michael's children, Steven's and Andrew's shares were devised in trust with my brother, John C. Dorcus, and my sister, JoAnn, as Trustees.

Q. Mrs. Kreh, involved in these proceedings is also a property known in your family as the "Smith Property". Can you state the names of the first members of your family to own this property?

A. That property was owned by my grandfather and grandmother.

Q. I show you certified copy of a deed executed by Luther C. Powell and others to Charles W. Dorcus and Emma E. Dorcus, his wife, dated February 25, 1928, and filed in these proceedings as Exhibit "E". Will you kindly examine the instrument, and state whether or not it correctly describes the "Smith Property"?

A. Yes.
