

SEVENTH: That the assertions by the Respondents of an alleged right to block, prevent, or limit the use of said right-of-way creates a cloud on the title of the property of the Complainants and seriously affects the marketability thereof and interferes with their reasonable use and enjoyment of said lot or parcel of land.

WHEREFORE, YOUR PETITIONERS PRAY:


1. That this Honorable Court determine that Complainants have a right to use said right-of-way or roadway from their lot or parcel of land to Pryor Road for themselves, their servants and friends and for use of motor vehicles or walking or otherwise for purposes of egress from and ingress to the lands of the Complainants aforesaid and to go and return at all times at his, her or their free will so that the Complainants may use and occupy their said land, and for the more convenient occupation thereof.

2. That the said Respondents be enjoined from interfering by threats, violence, force of arms, or the construction of fences, gates or other barricades with the rights of the Complainants to use said right-of-way from the property of the Complainants through, over and across the lands of the Respondents to the public road known as Pryor Road.

3. That the Court declare the nature and extent of said right-of-way and the rights to the use thereof.

4. And for such other and further relief as may be appropriate in the premises.


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
