Questions by Mr. Sheffield:

Q. Mr. Long will you state your full name, age and residence?

A. Raymond E. Long, 44, Box 87, Ijamsville, Maryland 21754

Q. Is that in Frederick County, Maryland?

A. In Frederick County, Maryland.

Questions by Mr. Horman:

Q. Mr. Long do you represent Lace, Inc?

A. As President

Q. It is a corporate body and you represent it?

A. Yes

Q. And in what capacity?

A. President

Q. What is its address?

A. 26323 Ridge Road, Damsacus, Maryland 20750

Q. In your capacity as President, did Lace, Inc. file a Bill of Complaint to quiet title upon a parcel or tracts of ground lying in New Market Election District?

A. Yes.

Q. Does that tract consist of in the aggregate 117.401 acres of land?

A. Yes. I understand the cloud does not affect the whole tract.
