

1 A. I haven't the slightest idea, Mr. Tom mentioned his name

4 him afterwards.

6 on the this is north it'd be on the southern end...

7 A. In the southern end of the tracks over to nearly south-
8 east end of the Rosencrantz property from John W. Lee over.

9 Q. Now, to your knowledge when your friend, William Thomas
10 Lee sold property to the Harrises and then on to the
11 Hamiltons and to the Hawkinses, did he retain part of the
12 property for himself?

13 A. Supposedly I guess he thought he had retained part of
14 it because he was going to keep a full acre down through
15 here when he offered to sell me a parcel and a couple
16 of other people parcels, he was going to keep a full acre
17 down here including the house and there was something like
18 nine-tenths (9/10) of an acre that sits somewhere along
19 in here and maybe that was the parcel that the house was on,
20 I don't know.

21 Q. I see. So, he was going to retain...

22 A. He was going to retain that.

23 Q. I see, alright. And, at the time of his death he was
24 retaining part of the land there?

25 A. Yes, I suppose that he thought he was retaining part of
26 it because he had sold it before I'm sure that his second
27 wife didn't sell any part of it.

28 Q. And, as far as you know no one else has lived in that
