

- Q. At one time you went there recently and had the property surveyed and have a general outline?
- A. Yes, by Mr. Brown.
- Q. Also, at one time, did anyone ever approach you to buy timber off the property?
- A. Yes, Penn Forestry. Off this and other property. I walked over the property but we did not reach satisfactory terms concerning price of timber so I did not allow them to cut it.
- Q. As anyone ever camped there?
- A. Yes, but not on this particular parcel.
- Q. Along with this, there are many other parcels, totaling over fifty acres?
- A. In the entire area that I inherited there are a little less than one hundred fifty acres.
- Q. Over the entire area, including this particular parcel, you have exercised domain as your father did prior to you?
- A. Yes sir. Also, you mentioned earlier of people being allowed to camp there. Some of the persons I allowed to hunt the area camped on the grounds, but I don't know if they camped on this particular lot.
- Q. Of course this area is mountainous and heavily wooded?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Concerning the survey done by Mr. Brown, this was a survey done for multi-number of lots of approximately 150 acres?
- A. Yes sir.
- Q. And this plat is recorded in the Court house in Plat Book 12, Folio 150?
- A. Yes sir.
- Q. Also, this particular parcel is known as Lot No. 6 as is stated in the description for the real estate?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Also, was there an additional survey made including this lot and some other lots?
- A. Yes. The lot frontage was insufficient on some of the northerly lots so Mr. Brown did another survey changing the lot lines including Lot 6
