

6. That the real estate hereinbefore described is not susceptible of division without loss or injury to the parties entitled thereto, and that it would be for the best interest and advantage of all the said parties in interest that the said property be sold under a Decree of your Honorable Court, and that the proceeds accruing from said sale be divided among the said parties in interest, according to their respective rights.

TO THE END, THEREFORE:

1. That a Decree may be passed for the sale of the real estate hereinbefore described, under the direction of your Honorable Court, and that the proceeds thereof may be distributed among the parties entitled, according to their respective interests.

2. And that your Complainants may have such other and further relief as the nature and equity of their case may require.
