Rule 610

In an action, a party asserting a claim may at any time make a motion for summary judgment in his favor as to all or any part of the claim on the ground that there is no genuine dispute as to any material fact and that he is entitled to judgment as a matter of law.

NOTICE TO RESPONDENT

Take notice that unless to make a defense within the time allowed by law and rule of Court judgment will be entered against you. If you assert a defense, this Motion may be heard by the Court any time after the 22nd day of January, 1980, in accordance with Maryland Rule 610.C.1.
