Second: I hereby constitute and appoint my/wife, Ida Belle Hawes, to be the Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other wills and codicils by me heretofore made.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I hereunto subscribe my name and affix my seal, this 9th day of July, in the year 1930.
