

persons who appear of record or claim to have a hostile, outstanding right, have been made Defendants herein, to the best of the information and knowledge of the Plaintiffs; that no proceedings, either in equity or an action at law, are now pending to enforce or test the validity of the title to the land and premises more particularly described above.

The Bill of Complaint then prays that this Honorable Court issue its Decree (1) Declaring that the Plaintiffs, Howard J. Jennings and Marie L. Jennings, have the absolute ownership and right of disposition of all of the land and premises more particularly described above; (2) Prohibiting, restraining and enjoining the Defendants from asserting any claim whatsoever to the land and premises more particularly described above by an action at law or otherwise; (3) That notice of the object and substance of this Bill of Complaint be given by the Plaintiffs to the Defendants by publishing an Order of Publication in accordance with Rule 105b.1., Maryland Rules of Procedure; (4) That notice of the object and substance of this Bill of Complaint also be given by the Plaintiffs to the Defendants by ordering the Frederick County Sheriff to set up a copy of the Order of Publication upon the land and premises described herein in accordance with Rule 111, Maryland Rules of Procedure; and (5) For such other and further relief as to this Honorable Court shall seem just and proper.

WHEREUPON, it is this 5th day of January, 1984, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, Maryland, Sitting as a Court of Equity,

ORDERED, that the Plaintiffs by causing a copy of this Order of Publication to be inserted in a newspaper published in Frederick County, Maryland, once a week in each of three (3) successive weeks, before the 6th day of February, 1984, giving notice to the said Defendants and any persons claiming of, by and through said Defendants, of the object and
