

Let the records show that in the case of Mamie Iona Hutzell vs. The Unknown Heirs, Devisees, Personal Representatives, Descendants or Successors in Interest of Henry Ford, No. 34,099 Equity in the Circuit Court for Frederick County, Maryland, that C. Clifton Virts, Court Examiner, made inquiry as to the posture of the case and found that it was to be taken pro confesso by Order of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, Maryland, passed on the day of March, 1984, prior to the time the witnesses were sworn.

MAMIE IONA HUTZELL, COMPLAINANT, produced on her own behalf, after being duly sworn, deposes and says:

Questions by Mr. Virts:

Q. Would you state your name, age and residence?

A. Mamie Iona Hutzell, 220 South Main Street, Boonsboro, Maryland, 64.

Questions by Mr. Gastley:

Q. Mrs. Hutzell, when did you purchase this property?

A. In 1956.

Q. Was it January 28, 1956?

A. Yes.

Q. You purchased this property with your late husband?

A. Yes.

Q. It consisted of 2 parcels of land?

A. Yes.

Q. A 19 acre parcel and approximately a 1 acre parcel?

A. Yes.

Q. Since 1956 could you tell us what you have done to the property, have you paid the taxes?

A. We paid the taxes and fenced all of it except the mountain lot, we kept it clear and tended to the fields.

Q. The total 20 acres, you tended all this?

A. Yes, except the wooded area.

Q. The 1 acre, the particular piece in question in these proceedings, that piece was part of this acreage and was farmed?

A. Yes, it was in with the rest.

Q. Was this also fenced?

A. Yes.
