

one-third interest in the above described property descended; that to the best of Plaintiffs' knowledge, information and belief, the said George W. Stewart died in the year 1969 survived only by his widow Evelyn Stewart who was his only heir at law and to whom said undivided one-third interest descended; that the said Evelyn Stewart was one of the grantors named in the aforesaid deed which conveyed the said property to the Plaintiffs.

d. That to the best of Plaintiffs' knowledge, information and belief, the said Daisy Belcher died at a time unknown to the Plaintiffs, leaving her husband, Sumner Belcher, and her son, Paul Belcher, to whom her interest in said property descended; that neither her husband, Sumner, nor her son, Paul, nor anyone claiming title of the undivided one-third interest of Daisy Belcher joined in the aforesaid deed to the Plaintiffs; that although diligent search has been made, no further information concerning the said Sumner Belcher or Paul Belcher has been obtained.

e. That to the best of Plaintiffs' knowledge, information and belief, Mary Shamwell died in the year 1932 at which time an undivided one-third interest in the said property descended to her then heirs, Octavia Shamwell, her daughter; Olga Shamwell, her daughter; and Emma Shamwell-Sewell, her daughter; subject to the dower rights of her husband, Lewis Shamwell; that upon the death of the said Lewis Shamwell at a time unknown to the Plaintiffs, his dower rights as described above were extinguished and fee simple ownership of the said undivided one-third interest remained in the said Octavia Shamwell, Olga Shamwell and Emma Shamwell-Sewell.
