I further enclosed in the letter copies of the original Bill of Complaint and Answers thereto for Ralph Yarnick and James Pappas, and requested Mrs. Yarnick to forward these papers to Mr. Yarnick and Mr. Pappas for their signatures if they wished to sign them.

4. That on or about the first day of September, 1974, I placed a long distance telephone call to John M. Brennan, Esq., Ralph Yarnick's former attorney, and asked Mr. Brennan if he knew the whereabouts of Ralph or Eleanor Yarnick. I received a letter from Mr. Brennan, dated the 5th day of September, 1974, stating that Mr. Brennan had no idea of the whereabouts of either Ralph or Eleanor Yarnick.
