Mr. Sparks made a motion to accept the "Caroline County Retirement Plan" but with the stipulation that County funds be invested in Fixed Income programs. Motion seconded by Mr. Andrew and unanimously passed by The Board.

After Mr. Baynard's death and the moving up of Joseph E. Tinley, Jr. the work of Stock Clerk had been done by Marvin Mac-Donald, Bookkeeper and Accounting work. This continued for three months. Because of the volume of work and that Mr. Mac Donald was filling two positions and because he was having to take work home in evenings and on weekends, Mr. Tinley about a month after Mr.

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Baynard's death okayed Mr. Mac Donald to receive a days pay per week for this work which terminated upon Joseph E. Tinley's move to this position. Mr. Mac Donald received for this work \$664.32 but the result this filling in also saved the County Roads Board in excess of \$4,000.00 which would have been paid to Mr. Baynard. The Board after listening to Mr. Tinley and Mr. Mac Donald noted that since he was a salaried employee and should receive no extra pay even though it was a separate job. Motion by Mr. Andrew, seconded by Mr. Sparks to have Mr. Mac Donald reimburse the County for this the \$664.32. Motion unanimously approved by The Board.

The Board noted that the \$12,977 salary paid to Mr. Baynard should be placed in a special contingency fund in the Budget until the problem of this position is clarified.

The Board noted that the 5% cost of living increase included in the tentative budget would have to be deleted because the County Court House have not received same.

Motion by Mr. Sparks to approve the County Roads Board Budget as amended was seconded by Mr. Andrew and unanimously passed by the Board.

The problem concerns runoff water which accumulates in field owned by Glimes Bros. and comes to the County Road across the road and unto his property. This usually happens during flash flooding or heavy rains, when this happens topsoil from Glimes Farm and gravel from the County Road is deposited in the fields belonging to Mr. Payne, this caused his crops to be drowned out. The Board instructed Mr. Tinley look into a method to stop this problem.

Mr. A. W. Spiering and Mr. Lloyd Simmons property owners on Boyce Mill Road - Co. Rt. #47 approached the Board for help in a drainage problem concerning them and The County Roads Board. A pocket of water which accumulates on Boyce Mill Road causes a dangerous situation for

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motorist on this road and backs onto their propertys. It is their request that The County install a pipe away from the road down along their propertys. In turn the County will be able to cut a ditch along the County Road and run the water that pockets on Boyce Mill Road to this pipe and away from the Road. After much discussion the Board concurred that they could not do the work on private property but they would supply the approximately 1,000 feet of 12" pipe needed for this project. The property owners must lay this pipe according to the instruction of the County Roads Board and a written aggreement must be given allowing future access to this pipe for maintenance. Mr. & Mrs. Thomas Lusk, owners of a subdivision property near Choptank requested The Board to have the road in their subdivision improved under the Front-Foot Assessment program. The subdivision would not have to meet the current Subdivision regulations since it was recorded before the current regulations. Mrs. Lusk presented to the Board signed proxy forms from all property owners in the subdivision giving her authorization to act for them. All property owners voted to have this road completed under the Front-Foot assessment program. As has already been made to each owner the total cost of the project would be \$5,604.00. The Board authorized the County Roads Board to proceed with this project.

Relating to the minutes of August 13, 1974, The Town of Denton has asked to the Board for the use of State-Aid funds for the reconstruction of town streets. It was their contention that State-Aid Funds has been accuring on several town streets but the money was going to the County Roads Board. An investigation of this matter with the State Highway Administration who oversee the State-Aid program informs us that towns with populations of under 5,000 persons do not receive State-Aid Funds.

Mr. Bell informed the Board that he was approached by interested people about having a 4-Way Stop made at the intersection of Newton & Hog Creek Road. Mr. Bell made a motion to have the signs installed. No second was received for this motion.

Mr. Frederick Lyons of near Harmony met with The Board to ask the County Roads Board to accept into the County System a narrow roadway which is now a private entrance. This road leads westerly from Ganeys Wharf Road towards the Choptank River. Mr. Lyons informed the Board that 14 persons are now using this road with more to come. The Board explained to Mr. Lyons that more Right-of-Way width would be needed to meet minium County requirements. This location is to be made as far as the Fryer property at this time.

Because of the way properties have been sold it is difficult to establish the true boundaries of the existing road. The Board instructed Mr. Hurley and his Firm to establish the exact centerline so they can proceed with this project.

The Board met with a Delegation of property owners from Line Road- Co. Rt. #132-A.B which runs from Md. Rt. 313 to Clark Road-Co. Rt. #148. Mrs. Dinah Hubbard acted as a Spokeswoman for the group and enumberated the problems that they encounter on this road, from being narrow and hazardous with several S type curves to being extremely bumpy and dusty. She noted that the road is

traveled by Two School buses daily and two mail routes. Mrs. Horner one of the Bus Drivers affirmed these conditions especially the narrow S curves with trees very close to the edge of road. The Board noted that they received a letter from Mr. Paul Shoemaker, Mail Driver on this road and he also affirmed these conditions. A copy of his letter is attached to these minutes. Mr. Tinley noted that this road is approximately 2.20 miles long and that he should have 40' foot Right-of-Ways for this project, in order to reconstruct the sharp curves and eliminate safety hazards. The Board informed the Delegation that this road could not be put into the Roads Program before 1977, but the Roads Board would prepare Right-of-Ways forms which they should have executed as soon as possible. In addition the Board said they would have calcium chloride put on the road to combat dust and also have the low tree limbs cut.

the meantime the Streets would be scraped more often and calcium chloride paced to keep the dust down.

Mr. Tinley told the Board that because of the large widening program for this year he would like to rent for approximately \$2,500 per month. The Board approved Mr. Tinley's request. There being no further County Roads business the meeting was adjourned.



Mr. Dave Orme of Alban Tractor Co., Inc. appeared before the Board with a proposal to sell to the County Roads Board a used Caterpillar #112-F Grader which has but 700 Operating hours. The total price would be \$36,500 or with the trade of a 19 year old County Machine a price of \$34,500 or with the trade of a 15 year old machine a price of \$33,500. The Board told Mr. Orme they would take this proposal under

consideration.

Mr. Leverne Bullock, a resident and property owner on Smithville Road appeared before the Board to protest an alleged request by property owner across the road from him have the County install a pipe under the road, and thereby run the water onto Mr. Bullock.

Mr. Ralph French, a property owner on Seward & Hog Lot Roads re-appeared before the Board to request some action on the proposal made the County Roads Board meeting on July 8, 1975. At that time The Board stated that they would have prepared the Right-of Way Forms for dispersal to the Property owners involved. This has not been completed as of this date. The Board informed Mr. French that because of the Flood damage caused to the County Roads System it has been impossible to accomplish much other work. - 2. Review the estimated road useage and needs through 1985.
- 3. Make recommendations on the need for increasing the size and scope of the improvement program.
- 4. Make recommendations on the nature and/or emphasis of any future Capital Improvement Programs for the County Roads System.

The Citizen's Road Review Committee shall:

1. Hold hearings and public meetings.

- 2. Meet with the County Superintendent of Roads, State Roads Engineers and County and State Planners.
- 3. Make and consider recommendations.
- 4. Submit a final report summarizing its findings; information presented to the committee; and containing the recommendations of the committee. In the event that there is disagreement on all or some of the recommendations; all those which obtain a majority vote of approval shall be considered the final recommendations of the committee. Recommendations supported by at least five committee members are to be included in the report under the heading "Recommendations considered but not approved".

It shall be the responsiblity of the Committee to:

- Hold at least two public hearings to receive comments on the need for road improvements. These meetings shall be advertised and records of comments included in the Committee report.
- 2. Hold regular meetings, either public or execuitve, at which time information may be gathered, and recommendations and comments made and considered.
- 3. Present within two months of formation of the committee a formal report to the Caroline County Roads Board.

The Committee shall consist of a chairman and at least ten-(10) members, all appointed by the County Roads Board and shall serve on an ad hoc basis.

They shall meet at the call of the Chairman with the stipulation that each member will be notified at least one(l) week in advance of any meeting.

Meetins shall be as informal as possible; however, the Roberts Rules of Order shall serve as a guide for proceedings. A quorum shall consist of one-half $(\frac{1}{2})$ the membership and all votes shall be determined by a majority of those present.

The Committee will be allotted a budget of \$750.00 for secretarial service, advertising and miscellaneous expenses. However, no committee member shall be reimbursed in any way for services rendered. The final report shall include an itemized account of expenditures.

Upon the submission of the final report, the Committee function will terminate and the members will be excused.

Miss Rachel Collison made a motion to establish the Review Committee as submitted, Mr. A. Curtis Andrew seconded the motion and Mr. Earl Bell made the motion unaminous.

Mr. Tinley informed the Board that the Department of Natural Resources had contacted him about using the County Air Compressor and Tools for work at the Smithville Dam Site. The Department stated that they hoped to have the Crossing opened in a couple of months. The Board stated that they would be in favor of loaning them the equipment if this will move the project faster.

Mr. Tinley informed the Board that State Highway Administration personnel had made an on-site inspection of Seaman Road- Co.Rt.#205-A a County State Aid project. The State approved all physical conditions of this project. All that is left is a State Audit of the cost records of this project in order to be reimbursed for approximately \$48,000 in State-Aid Funds.

Mr. Tinley informed the Board that he now has in one phase of construction for another approximately 8.65 miles of road and this amount

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will be ready for Surface Treatment during 1976 Surfacing Season.

Mr. Tinley presented to the Board findings of the State Highway Administration Eastern Regional Laboratory at Easton, Maryland as requested by The County Roads Board of Caroline County. The work consised of testing samples taken from the road in "Meadowbrook: sublivision at Federalsburg, Maryland. Mr. Tinley noted that the test showed that the material in this raod did not meet the County Base Material specifications, Copies of those test are attached to these minutes. There being no further County Roads business the meeting was adjourned.

The Petitioner must inquire of the County Roads Board for standards for construction and then be prepared for those standards and then be prepared to construct those standards. From this point a hearing on the matter of dedication and opening of the road will be necessary.

An alternative method to the Petition would be for the County construct the road according to provisions located in Caroline County Ordinances, SEction 461-473. The County would construct a road on the agreement of each adjoining Land Owner to pay a front-foot assessment charge.

One other area Mr. Brown noted was the signature of the County Roads Board on a Subdivision Plat. Mr. Brown's opinion is that this signature only acknowledges that the road is of sufficient width. Mr. Brown stated that the Subdivision Regulations of 1957 are still the sole guide for constuction of Roads in Caroline county.

Mr. Brown's final opinion is the County cannot accept a new road into the System that has not been Surfaced Treated unless there is some front-foot assessment charge to adjoining land owners.

The Report is as follows:

REPORT OF CAROLINE COUNTY ROADS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

In response to a series of recent citizen requests for further improvement of certain county roads, the Commissioners of Caroline County have voted to implement a county road improvement program. To assist

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in the development of such a program, the Commissioners named in September, 1975 a citizens committee to review all facets of the existing county roads system and to make specific recommendations concerning the expansion of an improvement program.

The committee met weekly for ten consecutive Monday nights, gathering information directly from the County Roads Superintendent, Joseph Tinley; State Highway Administration Engineers, James Wright and Henry Burger; State Dept. Planning Specialist, James Gatto; Delegate John Hargreaves; County Planner, Stewart Wright, Jr.,; County Attorney, Fdgar Brown; County Administrator, Edwin Richards; and County Commissioners, Curtis Andrew, Earl Bell, And Rachel Collison, Equally important to the contributions received from the above listed individuals were the statement made by citizens who appeared and testified at public hearing conducted by the Advisory Committee on October 13. Statements or comments made at the hearing by George Clendaniel, Norman Cohee, Horace Davis, Everett Gamber, Fred Gleockler, Jr., Bruce Hubbard, Diana Hubbard, Peggy Hubbard, Jerry Meredith, Irene Mullin, Mary Turkington and Thomas Turkington are reflected in the recommendations of this report. Members of the Advisory Committee also appreciate the many relevant thoughts and opinions expressed to each of us individually during the course of our work.

As a result of our study, the following problems in the operations of the county roads system are of serious enough nature to be included in this report along with recommendations for their solution.

1. Unimproved roads in the county system.

With approximately 160 miles of unimproved roads in the 500 mile county system, complaints arise during the inclement winter months from those citizens who must regularly use these dirt roads. In recent years the mileage of dirt roads annually upgraded to hard surface has fallen from about 15 miles per year to about 6 per year. The principal reason for this

reduction has been the rapidly rising costs of road building materials and labor, accompanied by a very modest increase in State and Federal highway tax receipts.

Historically, the cost of construction and maintenance of the Caroline County roads system has been paid for by highway user fees. These gasoline tax and vehicle registrations have been collected by the State of Maryland and distributed to the County through a locally favorable formula based on the number of vehicles registered in the County and the mileage of roads in the county system. With recent substantially higher

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gasoline prices and the trend toward smaller automobiles, high fuel sales are not increasing as in previous years. The present fixed tax rate on gasoline, therefore, fails to provide an increase in the funds that will be required to expand the county roads improvement program.

In order to finance the proposed long-range improvement program, several alternatives were considered. A proposal to increase the extent of road construction through the sale of state revenue bonds was rejected by the committee. The members recognized that such a sale would provide immediate funds for construction. However, repayment over a 15-year period is required from the same gasoline tax funds that already appear insufficient for an on-going road improvement program. The bond approach in the long run produced no new revenues for county road construction and would ultimately cost the county \$1.65 in user tax receipts for every \$1.00 received from a bond sale.

During the last ten years the County Commissioners have budgeted 6% of the county real estate taxes collected within the incorporated towns, for return to these same towns for road and street maintenance. The committee recognizes that a similar budgeting of a portion of the real estate taxes collected from beyond the incorporated towns would generate approximately \$100,000 each year for the county roads system and would eliminate an apparent inequity in the use of county tax revenues.

Strongly endorsing "user pays" and "pay-as-you-go" concepts, the committee supports a change in the state gasoline tax structure that will permit the tax to vary in relationship to the cost of fuel. This is necessary since the cost of building and maintaining roads is so directly affected by the price of oil and oil products needed in road construction. Our present state gasoline tax of \$.07 per gallon, regardless of the price of fuel, guarantees that the extent of road construction and maintenance will decrease as the price of fuel rises. The county has experienced this inequity in the last two years as road construction costs have risen 50% while fuel tax revenues have increased very little. The Committee also supports a statewide increase of \$10.00 in vehicle registration fees for full return to each subdivision. This would generate as much as \$150,000 per year for Caroline County.

2. Road Improvement Priorities

With 160 miles of dirt roads in the county system and an approximately \$45,000 per mile cost for improvement, it is obvious that a long-range

plan must be developed for selection and scheduling roads to be improved. It is unreasonable to place the burden of design, acquisition of rightsof-way and construction on the Roads Superintendent without also providing him a well prepared long-range plan of action. Such planning should be started immediately and should involve the County Planner, Roads Superintendent, no more than three interested citizens, plus certain outside professional consultation and engineering support as these five might consider necessary.

In developing a plan for review and approval by the County Commissioners, priority should be placed on the prompt improvement of some 32 miles of dirt roads that qualify for Federal Aid System Funds. The continued pressure at the national level to redirect these highway trust funds away from local road improvement and toward urban mass transit cannot be ignored. Local initiative should be directed toward preventing this diversion of Federal highway fuel taxes to non-highway uses. The threat of the loss of this source of road building funds to the County makes their immediate use imperative.

The next most important factor to consider in developing road priorties is to determine those segments which have the greatest traffic and increased traffic potential in the next five to ten years. Other factors such as mail, school bus, and truck delivery routes should be considered, but are of far less significance in developing a plan. A goal of ten miles of new road construction per year is not unreasonable for the next several years.

3. Right-of-way Acquisition

One of the principal obstacles to carrying out a well defined road improvement plan in the county has been the lack of a consistent procedure in securing the necessary increased rights-of-way for widening or relocating roads. Several heavily traveled road segments have been passed over when a single property owner has been unwilling to assign the required right-of-way increase. The Committee recommends in such cases that the county government exercise its power of eminent domain to secure necessary rights-of-way when no less than two-thirds of front footage right-of-way along the segment has been acquired through the presently used procedure.

Since the principal users of the remaining unimproved roads are those who own property along the roads, we fully endorse the long standing county policy of offering no financial compensation for increased rights-of-way on straight sections or curved sections requiring no relocation. However, if a curve relocated for safety factors takes more than one-half acre of property, the owners should be compensated at current fair market value for the land taken.

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Following a great deal of study and discussion, the Committee has concluded that the minimum right-of-way for improved roads should continue to be 40 feet as specified in the design standards incorporated in Resolution No. 35 approved by the County Commissioners in September, 1966. This right-of-way, coupled with a minimum 20 foot hard surface, is now needed in all cases to provide for safe and efficient movement of cars, trucks and farm equipment. Deviations from these and other standards listed in Resolution No. 35 should not be permitted. Although these standards appear more costly initially, evidence indicates that in the long term, lower maintenance costs more than offset the high construction costs.

4. New Sub-division Roads

In recent years the County has experienced a dramatic increase in subdivision activity. There are currently 49 sub-division plans on file with the county government. Many of these plans are not covered by subdivision regulations which specifically require the developer to assume the full cost of hard surfaced road construction within the sub-division.

With the Roads Board intent on upgrading substantial mileage of unimproved roads already within the system, the Advisory Committee recommends that the county strictly adhere to the acceptance of roads procedure adopted by the Commissioners in 1957. This, in effect, states that all roads built in sub-divisions must be dedicated to the county. To be accepted by the county, these same roads must be constructed to the standards established by the Commissioners with Resolution No. 35 in 1966. The Acceptance Procedure also clearly states that all costs of construction and hard surfacing of the new roads shall be at the expense of the developer or petitioners. Of course, the county will assume the costs of maintenance responsibilities once the road has been accepted into the county system.

In order to eliminate any "gray" areas with regard to road construction obligations, the Committee recommends that, without exception, no private roads serving more than one residence shall be permitted in any sub-division. The Committee is of collective opinion that in no case is there justification for county taxpayers to assume the cost of construction of roads within a sub-division.

In the cases of older sub-divisions where it may be impractical to hold a developer accountable for road construction costs, we recommend that whenever petitioners controlling two-thirds of the front footage of the private road in question commit themselves to a front foot county assessment which fully covers construction costs of drainage, base preparation and hard surface to county specifications, the county roads board should accept the road into the system and improve it to county standards. In such cases, engineering advice available to the roads board should be the sole criteria in determining the extent and cost of improving a road to minimum county standards. The Committee recommends that a procedure be established to fully advise purchasers of sub-division home sites that the County Roads Board will not build or hard-surface existing private sub-division roads at county expense.

Equipment Replacement 5.

The Committee has reviewed the operation, maintenance and repair of over eighty pieces of mobile equipment. We find that costs in operation and maintenance do not appear excessive and that repair costs are well below normal expectations. Much of this saving is due to the efficiency of a well-run central shop. However, we are concerned that there is no long range plan for replacement of extensively used equipment. We recommend that such a plan be developed and that a specific reserve, or sinking fund, for this purpose be started out of operating funds. This will permit the roads board to anticipate and plan for expensive equipment replacement in a more orderly and business-like manner.

6. Employee Salary and Benefits

The Committee commends the Roads Board for its recent decision to have

appropriate specialists conduct a job survey of all employees. This has made possible the preparation of accurate job descriptions and the establishment of more equitable salary scales. We also commend action by the Board which has resulted in the implementation of retirement plans and other fringe benefits which are comparable and consistent for all employees. These changes, coupled with the more extensive use of other personnel management techniques should help develop employee morale, attitudes and performance to an even higher level. All members of the Advisory Committee have appreciated the opportunity

extended by the County Commissioners to serve on this assignment. Our own

knowledge of the many procedures and problems related to the operations of the county roads system has been expanded tremendously. As the result of this study, we ask that the Commissioners respectfully consider and favorably act on the several recommendations incorporated in this report.

James M. Voss, Chairman

The Board extended their sincere thanks to Mr. Voss and The Roads Committee for their complete dedication and contribution to the task presented to them. The Board discussed for several minutes with Mr. Voss a few items in the report and then informed Mr. Voss the Report would be studied in depth and not just discarded.

Mr. Andrews made a motion to "Accept for inclusion into the Roads Board Minutes the Road Advisory Committee Report as delivered by Committee Chairman James Voss", motion seconded by Miss Rachel Collison and unanimously passed by The Board.

Mr. Bell told Mr. Tinley that he had been contacted by Mr. Ed Collins, American Corner Road, concerning a drainage problem on his property. Mr. Tinley informed The Board that he has seen the problem but it is on Mr. Collins' property and causes no drainage problem for the County Road.

There being no further County Roads business the meeting was adjourned.

Vouchers submitted by The County Roads Board were approved and ordered paid by The Board.

The Board approved Smith Ford, Inc. - Denton, Maryland as successful low bidder for One Panel Truck under Bid Proposal # RB-AP-1-6-76.

The Board approved Kaiser Aluminum & Chemical Sales, Inc. - New Castle, Delaware as successful low bidder for Bid Proposal # RB-AP-1-6-76.

The Board approved Republic Steel Corporation - Harrisburg, Pennsylvania as the successful low bidder for Asphalt Coated Steel Pipe under Bid Proposal RB-MP-1-6-76.

The Low bid prices were calculated using the amount of pipe purchased the previous year, a copy of which was supplied to each bidder with their bid proposal, and using the new bid prices of each bidder.

Mr. Tinley informed the Board that in talking with Tri Chevrolet, Inc. - Federalsburg, Maryland concerning Bid Proposal # RB-3-6-76 for

Mr. Gerardi said that where the Doctor is to have his Office and Residence is a piece of open field and that thestreets must be constructed to the property, also a parking lot for the convenience of patients. Mr. Gerardi reminded the Board that the project has benefits not only for residents of Federalsburg but for all of Caroline County with the added medical facilities. Mr. Tinley informed the Board that construction would mean the stripping of approximately 4 inches of top soil, by machine, from both Street and Parking Lot and then hauling in like amount of Bank Run Gravel, Grading and Compacting to give a durable gravel base street and parking lot. Mr. Gerardi said that the Town of Federalsburg is asking The Board of County Commissioners to construct the Street and Parking Lot with County Roads Board Forces, also the Town of Federalsburg would assume the cost of materials. Much discussion was had by the Board and delegation concerning the effect the Street opening would have so far as development of adjacent properties, by having the County involved in this road work. Reedy. Complaints were concerning heavy trucks breaking up the surfacing, speeding and endangering people and property. Mr. Wright state that subdivision regulationsstate that there be no private roads in a subdivision but Mr. Reedy had been allowed to sell property in order to finance the completion of roads to County standards. Mr. Wright declared that it was now time to require Mr. Reedy to bring the road up to the County standards so it can be taken into the County Roads System. Mr. Wright requested the authority to proceed with the matter. The Board told Mr. Wright and Mr. Tinley to meet with Mr. Reedy and to move on the requirements of the subdivision regulations. 141

Mr. Tinley and Mr. Wright showed to The Board plans for relocation of sharp curves on Seward Road - Co. Rt.#83-A, located north of Ridgely. No further correspondence has been received from Meadowbrook Developers.

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Complaints have been received concerning the condition of the Boat Ramp at Choptank. It has several b broken concrete slabs which make dangerous loading and unloading boats. After discussion The Board directed Recreation and Parks to acquire new concrete slabs and have the County Roads Board install same.

A small delegation of property owners from a samll subdivision off Poplar Neck Road, appeared before the Board to ask for improvements to their road. They were informed that this street was not in the County Roads System and only could be taken into the System by Front Foot Assessment of all property owners. Mr. John Ewing, owner of the property facing these homes, represented by an Attorney stated that according to his deed the property they are now using for a road is all on him. His Attorney stated that he did not want to be involved with any improvement of this road. The Board acknowledged that they couldn't get involved at this time since even the right-of-way now being used is unsettled. The Board told the property owners that they should get a survey made of the area to establish property lines. Mr. Ewing granted permission to cross his property to make this survey and also requested that he be kept informed of proceedings.

The Board again told the delegation that they must establish a boundary between themselves and Mr. John Ewing. The delegation told The Board that they thought that there was some racial discrimination involved as the reason they had not been helped. The Board insisted that the delegation must follow established procedure which meant that the property owners must first file a petition with the County Commissioners asking for acceptance into the County Roads System. Mr. Wright, County Planner, was instructed to see that the necessary forms and information reached the proper persons in order to start the project.

Mr. Tinley asked the Board for permission to Bid a new Sign Truck to replace a 1961 pickup which has over 200,000 miles and is practically rusting away from age. The Board told Mr. Tinley that he should list all his equipment purchases at one time so as to make only one bidding. No decision was reached by the Board.

In reponse to a request by The Board, Mr. Tinley told them he had contacted Mr. Jim Wright, District Engineer SHA, for a date as to when they plan to complete the line marking program on Caroline ounty Roads. Mr. Tinley was told the Contractor is working in Kent County and will be working his way down the Shore County by County. It will probably be

very late in the year before they reach Caroline County.

Mr. Wright, reported to the Board the progress being made with Five Developers who have subdivisions and streets and who have not conformed to all the subdivision regulations.

Stafford Heights- Mr. Mike Stafford has taken his case to the Planning Board in order to seek a waiver of the subdivision regulations.

> The Planning Board recommended to The county Commissioners that they accept the Gravel Base road and in the future be responsible for placing the surface on the road.

The Board after discussion agreed that they

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		could accept the Gravel Road according to the procedures set down in Resolution 5-A by which The Developer be responsible for the surfacing in the future or same to be done by Front=Foot assessment of Property owners involved.
	Federalsburg Estates -	Developers were told that they must submit a plan of sectional development, which means the subdivision should be sold in sections and roads constructed to these sections.
	Lor-Jay Estates -	All conditions conform to the subdivision regulations, except a drainage swale that must be constructed. The Developer asked a delay on construction of this until the adjoining lots are sold. A delegation of residents of the Poplar Neck Road area appeared before The Board to petition The County Roads Board to improve the final portion of Poplar Neck Road. The delegation outlined the large amount of growth and traffic in the area in recent years, also that

it is a quick and short route to Easton from Choptank area. The delegation reported that the road is narrow and extremely slippery in wet weather. They noted that at present even the school bus does not use this route. The delegation reported they were very cautious about using a little bridge on this road. Mr. Tinley, Supt of Roads Operations informed The Board and The Delegation that a recent independent inspection of this Bridge had stated that it was completely safe. Mr. Tinley asked as to how many of the Delegation were property owners. The Delegate spokeswomen declared that all the property owners had been asked to attend but most of them did not do so. Mr. Tinley informed the delegation that to construct this road it was necessary to have a 40' Right-of-Way and that at present he had several rightof-ways for this road. Mr. A.T. Blades whose property lies on a 90 type curve would be the most severly affected since the road would have to be relocated a great distance to conform to current State specifications. Mr. Blades was one of the property owners not in attendance. The Board informed the delegation that they would work on Right-of-Way acquisition for this road. Mr. Andrew asked Mr. Tinley to have sand applied to this road to alleviate the slippery condition and to contact Mr. Blades for his feelings toward the project as concerns his property.

Residents of Choptank who had attended the Board Meeting as part of the Poplar Neck Rd Delegation asked The Board for some help with a problem in Choptank and on Water Street. The problem is the rate of speed by young drivers at all hours of the day and night. The delegation asked The board to install Rumble strips to go along with the 25MPH signs now there to slow traffic down. The Board after some discussion informed the delegation that it would seek legal opinion from its Attorney before making any decision on the request.

Mr. & Mrs. Stewart, property owners in Hyeland Estates, near Marydel appeared before The Board to request them to take the street in Hyeland Estates into the County Roads System. The Stewarts outlined to the Board cases of extreme methods of harrassment he and his family have been subjected to because of his insisting that the Developer correct flaws in his house, some instances have come very close to bodily harm for his family. Mr. Stewart noted that he has had Mr. Reedy, the Developer in civil court several times but the harassment continues. Since the street is not in the County system he cannot get Police Pro-

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tection for patroling the street, making him have to come to Denton to get a warrant in order to protect himself.

It was stated that at the direction of the Board Mr. Tinley examine the subdivision for compliance with subdivision regulations. Mr. Tinley found that excessive abuse, apparently by automobile, to the road since the time it was first put in place has caused serious damage to the entire road. Mr. Tinley recommended that the entire roadway be resurfaced. The Board after some discussion agreed with the recommendations made by Mr. Tinley, and stated that the subdivision in cuestion be informed that they must comply. The Board talked with Mr. Robert Jarrell, Attorney for Mr. Reedy, informally and asked him to discuss the problem with his client. Mr. Jarrell indicated that he would do so.

The Board directed that a letter also be prepared and sent to Mr. Reedy stating the case as The Board has reviewed it.

Mr. Bell brought to the attention of The Board and Mr. Tinley several complaints he has received concerning the width of Payne Road surfacing. The concern by residents and users is that this route has become a serious safety problem because this route has become a By-Pass of Preston by trucks. Mr. Tinley stated that with the approval of the Board he could add 2 feet of surfacing to each side of existing surfacing using the existing roadway and still have shoulder area. No decision was reached.

Mr. Tinley told the Board that he had been approached by D.M.Stoltzfuss Son of Talmage, Pennsylvania concerning a stockpile they have of approximatley 8,000 Tons of Md. #4 Crushed Limestone, which they can deliver this winter. D.M. Stoltzfus is the current holder of the County Roads Board Stone contract and the Contract is enforce until December 31, 1976. Stoltzfus has noted that a price increase is indicated on any new contract This stockpile of stone would be delivered at the current contract price. The Board asked Mr. Tinley whether or not he had a need of this stone. Mr Tinley informed The Board that whether or not this stone is purchased he will have to purchase stone anyway for projects now under construction and due to be completed this year. By this timely purchase a substantial amount of money could be saved. The Board approved the purchase of the stone on the current contract.

Mr. Tinley reported to the Board and Mr. Richards that on the Five roads being considered in the Public Works application 3 of the roads have the Right-of-Way agreements cleared and Kibler Road and Cedar lane each have one outstanding right-of-way. Mr. Tinley stated he has a meeting set with one property owner and is asured of acquiring his right-of-way. The

other property owner lives some distance from Caroline County and will take some time to acquire.

Mr. Tinley presented to the Board a copy of Bid specifications for the purchase of a Pickup Truck for use by County Roads Sign department. This would replace a 12 year old vehicle which is in poor condition. The vehicle wanted is a vehicle with a truck cab that contains an extra large cargo space behindthe seat. Mr. Tinley stated that this was needed for protection of signs and tools a condition that does not now exist. The Board was concerned that this type vehicle would be much more expensive that a conventional type pickup. The Board asked Mr. Tinley to inquire into the prices between the two types of truck. Mr. Richards informed Mr. Tinley that there are still several greenbox locations that needed cleaning and he would like Mr. Tinley to form a crew of CETA employees to accomplish this. Mr. Tinley acknowledged Mr. Richards request and said he would do so.

This is only multiplied at night where houses are a distance apart. People are getting very concerned about opening their doors to strangers or even talk to them through the door. At night this could necessitate a several mile walk under most difficult weather conditions to reach a telephone. It is Mr. Tinleys plan to supplement our present Radio System with a cheaper emergency system or by the use of Citizen Band Radios in the Graders. With C.B's they could contact the Sheriff's Dept. on an Emergency Frequency or one of many other C.C. Radios in the County Roads Board for action, thereby saving precious hours of day time during critical periods. The Board concurred that some remedy should be considered for

this problem. The Board directed Mr. Tinley to have a C.B. unit installed in a Grader for Test purposes and have the machine transmit to the Sheriff's Dept. from an area where he would usually be working, and report back with their results.

The most serious difference is in the width of the shoulders. The County proposed 2-5.' shoulders, the State has requested 2-6- shoulders. Mr. Tinley informed the Board that with 5' shoulders the road could be constructed in the now existing 40' roadway as originally built by The State Roads Commission. To go to 6' shoulders means filling all ditches and recutting them a foot or so farther back, also disturbing all present grassed slopes. The change to 5' shoulders would have no adverse affect on the safety standards for the completed roadway. Mr. Tinley

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informed The Board that he was making a formal request to the State Highway Administration for the changes that have been discussed.

The Board asked Mr. Tinley to have something done concerning the drainage at the Greenbox location on Guard Road as soon as possible, since residents of the area are having difficulty getting to the box with trash.

Brought up for discussion was a revision to the County Roads Board Pension Plan. Changed would be the formula for determining benefits, at present the formula is 5% of average monthly earnings times the number of years employed. This would be changed to 1% of average monthly earnings times number of years employed, plus full retirement at 55 years of age with 25 years of service, if the employee so elects. This would also bring the County Roads Pension in line with one the County Courthouse Employees are under. After discussion the Board decided to withhold their decision until they could study the proposal further.

Dear Mr. Thomas:

This letter is in response to your inquiry on how the roads in and leading to the Tammuxzena Shores Subdivision can be paved. The Roads Board has reviewed the history of this subdivision. Based on this review, it is our opinion that the developer, Mr. Hope Harrison, has no obligation to pave the roads under the subdivision regulations then in effect.

There are, however, several options available to you by which the roads can be paved:

- The owners of 51 percent of the frontage along any road can request paving or improvement by the County under Resolution 20 (copy enclosed). Costs are assessed on the basis of each owners front-footage. One-tenth of this cost is added to each owner's tax bill for 10 years.
- 2. The residents of the subdivision can raise the money among themselves, and hire a private contractor to bring the roads up to County standards.
- 3. The residents of the subdivision can raise an amount of money equal to the County's cost if the paying was done by front-foot assessment. This meney eauld be dependent in an escrow account and used by the County to upgrade the roads.

Under any of the options above, a deed would have to be recorded to convey the right-of-way to the County Commissioners.

Until a Resolution is adopted by the Roads Board accepting them into the County system, these are private roads and they cannot be legally maintained by the County.

I hope that this letter has clarifled the position of the Roads Board. If you have any questions, please contact Alan Visintainer, County Planner.

Subject: Ditch - Cedar Lane Subdivision

Several weeks ago, Mr. Bill Reckitt came before the Roads Board to discuss the ditch along side his property (Lot #31 of Cedar Lane Subdivision). He presented pictures showing the unsightly character of the ditch. The ditch banks are eroded and it is filled with assorted rubbish and trash. He requested some form of action to relieve the condition.

I have been unable to find any recorded easement for the ditch. None is shown on the plat. Therefore, it appears that the Roads Board has no responsibility for maintaining it, nor should it assume any unless an easement is recorded. The ditch does benefit the road by providing drainage, but is doing that adequately at the present time. Also, John Rieck indicates that it should not be filled or blocked because of possible benefits to the nearby septic systems.

In conclusion, it appears that the ditch and its maintenance is the sole responsibility of the adjoining property owners. You could ask for an easement and maintain the ditch at some future time when it no longer adequately drains the road.
