The material facts in this case are the following, Adolphus Wolff, a resident of the City of Caracas in the State of Venezuela departed this life on or about the 10<sup>th</sup> of May 1850, having, previously made and executed his last Will and Testament in Caracas, that the said Wolff at the time of his death, being possessed of a large Estate, scattered over Europe, the United States, St. Thomas and South America, by his said Will, (an authenticated copy of which has been filed in this Court, and is made a part of the proceedings in this case) appointed two sets of Executors, to wit, Messrs H. M. Facht, W. Kimmelin and Everhull Telius (and in case of the latter declining to serve which he did) Everhull C. Telius all residents of Bremen, for the care and management of his property in Europe, the United States, and St. Thomas, and another set for the care and management of the residue of his Estate. That the Merchants house of F. W. Bruun & Sons, at the death of the said Wolff, had in their possession a large amount of funds belonging to said Wolff, and that Schule Bruun one of said firm was by a power of Attorney dated the 23<sup>rd</sup> of October 1853, from the Executors above named authorized to act for them in reference to said funds and if necessary to take out letters of Administration in their stead. That said Executors being all foreigners and thereby disqualified by the laws of this State from taking out Administration here. Schule Bruun applied for and obtained from this Court Letters of Administration with the Will annexed of the said Wolff on or about the 25<sup>th</sup> of Nov: 1853. That in due course of law, the said will was returned to this Court an Inventory of the property here, consisting of a large amount of Cash and twenty five Shares of the Stock of the Maryland Sugar Refining Company, (a joint Stock Company incorporated under the Laws of this State) appraised at the sum of \$25,000. That said Bruun settled an account in this Court on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January, in which after charging himself with the dividends on said Stock and six per cent on the Cash in his hands, and after deducting his Commissions, State Tax and Court Charges left a net balance due of \$105,053.12. That the said Bremen Ex<sup>rs</sup> on or about the 12<sup>th</sup> of June 1855, by a new letter of Attorney, revoked the power of Attorney previously given to said Bruun and appointed Albert Schumacher of this City, the Petitioner their Attorney, with power to receive from Bruun the entire Estate in his hands and to give him valid receipts and releases for the same.

That the other Executors under the Will are residents of the City of Caracas, and are appointed by said Will to have the custody and management of the property of said Wolff at Caracas. These latter Executors make

no claim whatever to the funds here. Upon this statement of facts, the Petitioner contends,

First, That the Stock of the Maryland Sugar Refining Company, a joint Stock Company, incorporated by this State, should not have been included in the Inventory, but should have been transferred to the Executors of Wolff, who are authorized under his Will to take charge of the property in the United States, in pursuance of the provisions of the Act of 1849, ch. 447, and that no Commissions should have been allowed upon said Stock.

Secondly, That the percentage of Commissions allowed the said Bruun is too large and ought to be reduced, and

Thirdly, That the balance of the funds in the hands of said Bruun ought to be paid over to him as the authorized Attorney of the said Executors, to be remitted to them for the uses and purposes of the Will of said Wolff.

With regard to the first point, the Court after a careful examination of the Act of 1849, ch. 447, is of opinion that the language of the Act is too plain and obvious to admit of a doubt as to its true construction. Under this act the title to the Stock devolved upon the death of Wolff upon his Executors duly appointed, or in other words the title vested in them subject to be divested only in the event of Administration being taken out by the next of kin, a residuary Legatee or a Creditor. Now it is not pretended that Bruun stands in either of these relations. But it is contended that the Executors represented by the Petitioner are not the parties entitled under the first section of this Act, to receive the Stock in question, not being constituted and appointed in the manner contemplated by said Section. But this objection we do not think is tenable as we shall endeavor to show when we come to consider the third point. This Stock then in our view of the Act of 1849, ch. 447, ought not to have been included in the Inventory, but should have been transferred after the notice given as required by the Act to the Executors of Wolff represented by the Petitioner. It follows that Bruun ought not to have received Commissions upon this item in his Account.

With regard to the second point, to wit, excessive Commissions, the Court having fixed the rate of Commission at the time required by law upon a statement of facts and circumstances, which at the time in their Judgment justified the allowance made, will not now alter it.

The last and principal question remains to be considered, - It is conceded that the Adm<sup>r</sup> Bruun has, as is shown by his Account, a large balance of funds in his hands, and the question arises, who is entitled to receive it? - Shall it be remitted to the Executors residing in Bremen, who by the provisions of the Will are exclusively vested with authority to take charge of the property in the United States, or shall it be remitted to the

March 1857

Executors residing in Caracas, the domicile of the Testator, or will the Court refuse to send the funds abroad, but retain them here?

The only heir of the large Estate of the Testator is a son, a minor, now residing in Paris. If we regard the administration here as ancillary, the objects & purposes of that administration have been accomplished. There being no claimants of the funds here standing in the relation of Creditors, legatees or heirs, the Court can perceive no reason for retaining the funds here.

The principle laid down by the Court in the leading case of *Harvey vs Richards*, 1 Abb. 381, and fully recognized and adopted by the Court of Appeals of this State, in the case of *Caputy et al. vs Mayor*, 14 M. R. p. 1, and also in the case of *Williams vs Williams*, in 5 M. R. p. 457, is, that the Court in cases of this nature will exercise a judicial discretion according to the circumstances of the case before it. Justice Parker in delivering the opinion of the Court in the case of *Harvey vs Richards*, says, "When there are no Creditors here, and no heirs or legatees here, but all are resident abroad, there can be no doubt that a Court of Equity would direct the remittance abroad upon the application of any competent party."

Who then are the parties competent to receive the funds in question? This question in our opinion is answered by the Will of the Testator. The authority conferred by the Will must, however, be in accordance with the laws of the domicile of the Testator (Story, Conflict of Laws, §. 458.) and the Will itself construed, according to the same Laws. (Story, Conflict of Laws, §. 491.) who are the proper persons to take under a designation personarum is a point to be ascertained, by the Law of the place where the Will is made, and the Testator is domiciled. (Ibid. §. 479, see and see also notes on page 865. 2<sup>d</sup> Ed. Story's Conflict of Laws.) Let us now see whether the persons designated in the Will of the Testator to take charge of the property in Europe, the United States and St. Thomas, are entitled under the Laws of the Testator's domicile, to exercise that authority. In consequence of certain hindrances arising from the different local jurisdictions in which the property of the Testator is situated, the Bremen Executors by Petition filed in their behalf, applied to the Circuit Court in Caracas, having jurisdiction in the case, and before whom the Will was attested and verified, and prayed that the Court, would by a decree declare what were their rights under the Will according to the Laws in force in Venezuela, the Court accordingly passed a decree, an authenticated Copy of which is made a part of the pleadings in this case, wherein they declare that the Testator Wolff by the 20<sup>th</sup> clause of his Will appointed as Executors, in this Country (that is in Venezuela) Messrs. Frederica Stacy, Marcos & Luciano Santana & Doctor Jesus Maria Goyea. For the Inte-

ests which he held in St. Thomas, the United States and in Europe, he in like manner designated as Executors Messrs. H. W. Pucht, R. Reinher, and Everhart Delius, Seneca, and in default of this latter, his son, Everhart C. Delius. The decree goes on to pronounce these as well as the first named general Executors, by virtue of their appointment made by the Testator, and it is their duty to cause to be executed and complied with the dispositions w<sup>ch</sup> the Testator Adolphus Wolff has set forth in his Will; and they in consequence thereof, are fully authorized by the laws in force in this Country to discharge the trust.

Here there is a full recognition of the powers of the Bremen Executors under the Will of Wolff by the tribunal before whom the Will was attested, so far then as the funds in this Country are concerned, the Executors appointed by the Will of the Testator to have the care and management of his property in this Country are right-fully appointed under the laws in force at the domicile of the Testator. Being thus legally invested with a right to demand the funds here for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of the Testator's Will, this Court in the exercise of their judicial discretion will direct the funds to be paid over to the Petitioner, (see also the case of *Hunter vs. Bryson* 5 G. & Schm. 488.)

It is therefore by the authority of this Court, adjudged, ordered and decreed this 24<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year 1857. That John C. Bruun Adm<sup>r</sup> with the Will annexed of Adolphus Wolff forthwith settle another account, in which he shall be allowed a credit for the twenty five shares of the Stock of the Maryland Sugar Refining Company, appraised at \$25,000, as erroneously included in the Inventory returned by him to this Court; and he shall debit himself in said account with the amount of Commissions allowed on said Stock amounting to the sum of \$500. And it is further adjudged, ordered & decreed, that the said Bruun pay over to Albert Schumacher an Attorney of Messrs. H. W. Pucht, R. Reinher and Everhart C. Delius, Executors of the Will of Adolphus Wolff, the entire balance which shall appear by said account to be in his hands upon receiving from said Albert Schumacher a Release in full for the same.

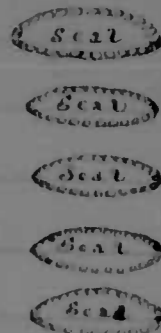
