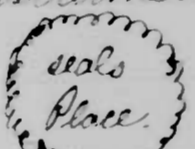

330 Amendment of the Charter of the Academy of Music of Baltimore City
4/5 Stamps cancelled

Know all Men by these presents that the corporation heretofore formed by virtue of the General Laws of this State under the name of the Academy of Music of Baltimore City and whose certificate of Incorporation bears date April 5th 1870 and is duly recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Baltimore City has adopted the following alterations and amendments of the articles and provisions of its charter that is to say we do hereby certify that the capital stock of the said corporation consisting of six thousand (6000) shares of the par value of fifty (50) dollars each amounting in the aggregate to three hundred thousand (300,000) dollars is and shall be divided into two classes to be known respectively as class A and class B each of which classes shall consist of three thousand (3000) shares. The privilege of free seats provided for in the original charter shall not attach to the holding of stock of class B but the holders of said stock shall be entitled as an equivalent therefor to such priority over the holders of stock of class

A in the receipt of dividends as is hereinafter provided in all other respects the rights and privileges attached to the holding of the two said classes of stock shall be identical in any and every year in which a dividend shall be declared out of the net earnings of the corporation no part thereof shall be distributed or paid to holders of stock of class A until after there shall have first been set apart for payment to the holders of stock of class B a clear dividend of six per centum for such year upon the par value of their said stock the remainder of said net profits to be divided shall then be applied so far as may be towards the payment of a like dividend of six per centum to the holders of stock of class A and in case the net earnings so to be divided shall amount in any one year to more than six per centum upon the whole capital stock of both classes the surplus over such six per centum on the whole capital stock shall be distributed equally between the holders of both classes and in no event shall a dividend be declared to the holders of either class of stock for any year except out of the net earnings of that year. And in order to effect an equitable division of the capital stock into the two classes as herein provided it is hereby declared and certified that the eighteen hundred and forty (1840) shares of stock of the par value of ninety two thousand (92,000) dollars are not yet subscribed for together with two hundred (200) shares of the par value of ten thousand (10,000) dollars which have heretofore been subscribed for in sums less than one thousand (1000) dollars making in the aggregate two thousand and forty (2040) shares of the par value of one hundred and two thousand (102,000) dollars shall belong to and be issued only as of the class B and that the remaining nine hundred and sixty (960) shares of the par value of forty eight thousand (48,000) dollars part of the forty one hundred and sixty (4160) shares heretofore subscribed for necessary to complete the half of the capital stock constituting class B shall be for the purpose of said division ascertained and set apart in the following manner namely all the holders of the three thousand nine hundred and sixty (3960) shares heretofore disposed of who are entitled under the original charter to free seats shall have the privilege for fifteen (15) days (to be fixed by the Board of Directors) of recording in a book to be prepared for the purpose their preference for the one or the other class of stock and in case the number of shares represented by those recording their names as in favor of taking stock of the class B shall exactly equal the number of shares of that class still to be issued viz nine hundred and sixty (960) shares.
