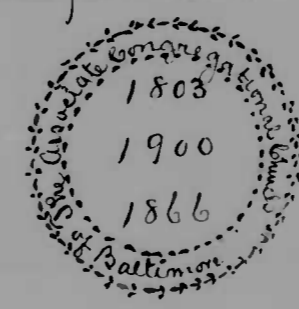
First. The first paragraph of Article II of the said Charter was and is changed and amended so as to read as follows
