We the subscribers, The recorder and three of the Aldermen of the City of Annapolis having first qualified agreeably to the Constitution and form of Government of this State, and appointed Thomas Harwood of R. Clerk to the Election, and duly qualified him agreeably to law. Do hereby certify, that on the first Monday of October in the year Eighteen hundred and Three, being the third day of the same month, we held an election at William Batons Tavern in the City of Annapolis, for two delegates to represent the City in the General assembly agreeably to the Constitution and form of Government, which was continued by adjournment from day to day until Thursday the sixth day of the same month inclusive, when the Poles were closed, and on opening the Ballot Box and counting all the Ballots, it appeared that Arthur Shaaff and John Muir Esquires had a majority of votes, that is to say Arthur Shaaff had

had one hundred and seventy six votes, and
John Muir one hundred and forty
six votes, and that the said Arthur
Shaaff and John Muir were duly elected
Delegates - We do therefore
return the said Arthur Shaaff and
John Muir Esquies as duly elected
Delegates to represent this City in the
 ensuing General Assembly of this State
 Given under our hands and seals
 this sixth day of October in the
 year of our Lord one thousand and
 Eight hundred and Three
