Saturday 21st of April 1649 being the last day of the Assembly

The House being called all assembled but Mr. White, and Mr. Hatton were absent & were excused by the Governor

The Bill of charges being read it was ordered that the same should be as follows viz:
It is ordered by the authority of the present Assembly that the Governor shall
issue out the writ to the Sheriff of St. Marcs County to summon two hundred
out of every hundred to be chosen by the hundred to make a list of
some time and place to be appointed by the Governor in October next
and make Affidavit on all the inhabitants of one hundred of the charge
that shall be made the present year. This order for the levy is passed by all
but Mr. Brown.
A letter was read to be sent to Lt. Lopez and signed by the
whole House p^r sent.

The Governor dissolved the House.

Acts and Ordors of Assembly assented unto & enacted and made
at a general Session of the said Assembly holden at St. Marcs on the
one and twentieth day of April Anno Domini 1649 as followeth viz:

An Act concerning Religion

Whereas we are in a well governed and christian Commonwealth matters regarding Religion
and the Honor of God ought in the first place to be taken into serious consideration
and endeavored to be settled as it heretofore ordained and enacted by the right
Honorable Lord Baron of Baltimore absolute Lord and Proprietary of the
Province with the advice and consent of the said General Assembly that whereas
