In this position they awaited new transportation, and soon they started with their prisoners for the city, where the captured rioters have been confined in the arsenal to await the action of the United States Government.

Tak Ballers Utilized. - A few years ago I met a German on the street one evening, and noticed on his arm a printer's ink roller. I asked him what he was going to do with it. He said, "That ink roller would not throw it away if the printer would. I have several fruit trees that don't seem to grow any for some year's past, and I put this old ink roller into them about two inches square, and put them about eight or ten to a tree, between the roots of the tree a foot apart, and two inches in the ground. This is a powerful vegetable manure, does not fly away under a shower at a year, and gives the tree a powerful shoot ahead." He also said that the "shoot ahead" was death to the knots on pear trees. Several hundred pounds of old rollers have been used in this town and vicinity with excellent effect in making pear trees "shoot ahead," but I cannot speak so positively as to the effect on the knots, those interested in fruit trees think, however, there is something in it.
