THE MOUNTAINS CROSSED

A BOLD DASH TO CONSTANTINOPLE

The Russian Troops Cross the Balkans and Threaten the Mukhtar Pasha's Victories.

LATEST NEWS FROM THE SEAT OF WAR

London, July 16.--Reuter's dispatch from Sofia reports that the army corps under Lieutenant General Mehmet Ali, arrived at Nisch from Novi Bazar today.

A Reuter telegram from Constantinople confirms the report that the Russians (who number fifteen, not eighteen, battalions) have crossed the mountains through the Tyvradzka pass.

This passage is supposed to be a feint to withdraw the Turks from the Shkips pass. An Adrianople telegram says that the Russian general, Mukhtar Pasha, has been ordered to wait for reinforcements before advancing further.

Reuter's St. Petersburg dispatch says a large contingent of the Russian army is marching on the Balkans. The news of the crossing of the Balkans has evidently caused great excitement in Constantinople.

Reuter's Constantinople telegram says that the inhabitants of the frontier villages are being driven from their homes, and that the Russians are carrying on great activity in the Turkish frontier.

There is a general impression that the foreign powers will intervene.

Reuter's telegram from Adrianople is as follows: "The first detachment of the German cavalry has arrived at Jamboli. It is believed he is entrusted with a mission. Troops and war material continue to arrive by railway."

CONSTANTINOPLE, July 16.--An official dispatch announces that Eyoub Pasha has attacked the Russians under the Grand Duke Nicholas north of Tirova and defeated them, with a loss of 12,000 men, and the grand duke himself was killed.

The bridge at Stojanovo was destroyed by the Russians. One monitor was subsequently sunk by torpedoes. The Porte official declares that the Russians have burned alive inhabitants of Jons, near Tirova, who had taken refuge in a mosque.

ALEXANDRIA, Egypt, July 16.--An additional contingent of 3,000 troops has sailed for Constantinople.

London, July 16.--Reuter's telegram from Constantinople says the report of the defeat of the Grand Duke Nicholas is not confirmed by dispatches from Redif Pasha. It was probably based on false reports made to the local authorities.

Reuter's Constantinople telegram says that the Russians had been beaten in the Tyvradzka pass. The station master at Jamboli, who was subsequently killed, was a Russian.

London, July 17.--The Standard's correspondent at Vienna telegraphs that in consequence of the crossing of the Balkans it is announced that the return of the Emperor of Austria to that city, which will be in a few days, the present position of affairs will be entirely changed.

A WONDERFUL WILL

Its Legality Turning Upon the Color of Its

A Negro Riot in Kentucky.

The negroes, at the instigation of Frederick Bell, from Clarksville, Tenn., made a rush to rescue the prisoners, when a riot ensued, in which Deputy Marshal James E. Wilcox was shot through the arm. The marshal was killed, and one negro, Mark Johnson, killed, and several others in custody, and the officers are on the alert."

MONTREAL IN MOUWING

BURYING THE MURDERED ORANGEMAN

Visitors Pour In From All Sections to Take Part in the Procession--A Generally Quiet Day Ending in a Fight.

ONE MAN REPORTED KILLED OUTRIGHT

Montreal, July 16, 11 A. M.--So far everything is quiet, with fair prospects of peace during the day. St. James street is thronged with people, but the rough element is conspicuous by its absence. The funeral procession will be taking place at 2 o'clock, and the body of the murdered Orangeman will be carried to the cemetery.

Since Saturday over 20,000 people visited the hall. An order has just been issued by Colonel Fletcher, deputy adjutant general, for the whole military force to turn out. This is taken as a precaution. An influential meeting of the St. George's society, at 10 o'clock this morning, decided to walk in the Hackett funeral procession in a body. Resolutions were passed condemning the mayor for criminal negligence.

12.30 P. M.--The military have been called out. There will be six regiments of volunteers on duty and a troop of cavalry. They will be stationed at different points on the route of the procession, and so arranged that the procession will always be before the eyes of the military. Four hundred Orangemen have just arrived from Ottawa; about twice that number will come from the eastern provinces, and a large contingent from the United States will take part in the procession. At an urgent meeting of the police committee the mayor's conduct was censured, and instructions were given to the police to be on their guard against the Orangemen. The police committee will meet to-morrow morning to discuss the matter.

THE WAR IN ASIA

Continued Success of the Turks--Contradictory Reports from Bejaiz.

London, July 16.--The Times correspondent writes from Bejaiz, July 12, as follows: "Mukhtar Pasha with the main army is in a strong entrenched position on a ridge eight miles south. The Russians have completely withdrawn from the ridge, and are retreating in disorder. The Russians lost one killed and five wounded."

This is the expedition referred to by the Daily News correspondent in a despatch previously published in this paper. It is believed that the Russian force was composed of 12,000 men, and that the Turkish force was composed of 10,000 men. The Turkish force was victorious, and the Russian force was defeated.
