STATE OF MARYLAND, DORCHESTER COUNTY, TO WIT:

The Grand Jurors of the State of Maryland, for the Body of Dorchester County, upon their oaths do present that H. Rap Brown, late of 310 Nelson Street, Atlanta, Georgia, on or about the 24th day of July, 1967, at Cambridge, Dorchester County, Maryland, feloniously, wilfully and maliciously did set fire to and burn, and cause to be burned, and aid, counsel and procure the burning of, the Pine Street Elementary School, the property of The Dorchester County Board of Education, there situate, on Pine Street in the City of Cambridge, Dorchester County, Maryland, in violation of Section 7, Article 27, Annotated Code of Maryland; contrary to the form of the Acts of Assembly in such case made and provided, and against the peace, government and dignity of the State.


SECOND COUNT

The Grand Jurors of the State of Maryland, for the Body of Dorchester County, upon their oaths do further present that H. Rap Brown, of 310 Nelson Street, Atlanta, Georgia, on or about the 24th day of July, 1967, in the City of Cambridge, Dorchester County, Maryland, unlawfully, wilfully and maliciously while acting in concert with others, did unlawfully assemble and riot with more than three other persons, to the Jurors unknown, in riotous acts, the use of force, arms and violence accompanied by immediate power of execution to the great disturbance of the public peace, and while so assembled and gathered together, did then and there for a period of three hours and more then next following, riotously remain and continue together making great noises, firing guns

and tumult to the terror and disturbance of the people, and against the peace, government and dignity of the State.

THIRD COUNT

The Grand Jurors of the State of Maryland, for the Body of Dorchester County, upon their oaths do further present that H. Rap Brown, of 310 Nelson Street, Atlanta, Georgia, on or about the 24th day of July, 1967, in the City of Cambridge, Dorchester County, Maryland, unlawfully, wilfully, riotously, tumultously while acting in concert with others, did unlawfully assemble, directed, encouraged and incited more than three other persons, to the Jurors unknown, in riotous acts, the use of force, arms and violence accompanied by immediate power of execution to the great disturbance of the public peace, and while so assembled and gathered together, did then and there for a period of three hours and more then next following, riotously remain and continue together making great noises, firing guns and tumult to the terror and disturbance of the people, and against the peace, government and dignity of the State.
