THE ADDISON FAMILY
DESCENDANTS OF ROBERT ADDISON, 1743.

I.

ROBERT ADDISON landed in Calvert County, Maryland, from Edinburg, Scotland, June 23, 1743. In the same vessel with him came Rev. Mr. COOK, a Protestant Episcopal clergyman, appointed to take charge of Lower Chapel, in Calvert County. Mr. Cook's family, his wife, three daughters and a son, came over in 1744. The son died early: his epitaph is on a marble slab in the wall back of the pulpit in the Lower Chapel. Robert Addison married **Isabella Cook**, daughter of Rev. Mr. Cook, Feb. 2, 1753. He had several brothers, one of whom was a Captain in the Royal Navy. During the Revolution Robert visited him under a flag of truce, while anchored in Chesapeake Bay. Another brother was Captain in the British merchant service. Several years later, Robert also visited him, while laying at the mouth of the Patuxent River, and thus met with a fatal accident. On returning from off the ship he fell into the ferry boat upon his breast, causing such injuries that he died on the way home, Dec. 30, 1785, aged 59 years and 8 mos. He was buried in the graveyard of Lower Chapel. His children were Isabella, who married John Montgomery, George Mitchell, James, Elizabeth and Nancy. Isabella Cook, wife of Robert Addison, died Nov. 28, 1809, in Baltimore, at the house of her son, George Mitchell Addison.

II.

George Mitchell Addison was born in Calvert Co., Jan. 7, 1764, and married **Ann Simmonds**, Aug. 27, 1785, of whom were born Isaac Simmonds, April 8, 1789, Isabella, who died in infancy, Margaret, Aug. 21, 1791, Frances, Feb. 28, 1797. (died without issue,) George Cook, Nov. 15, 1797. His first wife dying, George Mitchell Addison married **Elizabeth Scott**, by whom he had John, born Jan. 3, 1801, Robert, (died in infancy,) Samuel Scott, born Sept. 13, 1806, and William, July 1, 1810. George Mitchell Addison died in Baltimore, July 10, 1810, aged 49 years and 6 months, and his second wife died in Baltimore, Aug. 26, 1861, aged 81 years.
