Therefore Resolved that we the Vestry of Christ Church parish, actuated by a desire to do justice to all men and especially to our friend and former Pastor, and not by any solicitations of his, do take pleasure in placing in his hands this our testimonial of his good conduct

Resolved that during the three years he laboured amongst us, his conduct was invariably, as far as our knowledge or belief extends, such as became a Christian, and a zealous minister of the Gospel

Resolved that an earnest desire for the prosperity of the parish, coupled with a belief that an entire union among all the parishioners was necessary to the same, induced him, we believe, to resign, and his friends to suffer him to do so; and not that he was not esteemed or could not be supported here

Resolved that the Secretary be instructed to endorse these resolutions to the Revd Jas A Buck, at Hancock, Maryland, with assurances of our highest regard & esteem
