On Oct. 11, 1917, the men of Mutual and the neighboring community were invited by the Rev. Jos. E. Williams, rector of Christ Church, to meet at the Parish Hall at Mutual.

Mr. Williams, the rector, explained the aims and plans of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew.

It was resolved that such an order be formed, the Chapter to be located at Christ Church Parish.

Officers were elected as follows:—

Vice-Director, Dr. Philip Briscoe  
Secretary, D. G. Bennett  
Treasurer, Alexander Somerville

It was ordered that the meetings be held at 3-30 P.M. the first Monday of each month.

It was further ordered that a campaign for an increase in the membership be organized at once.

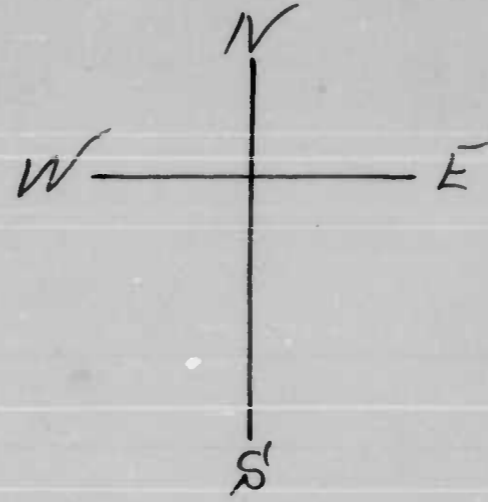

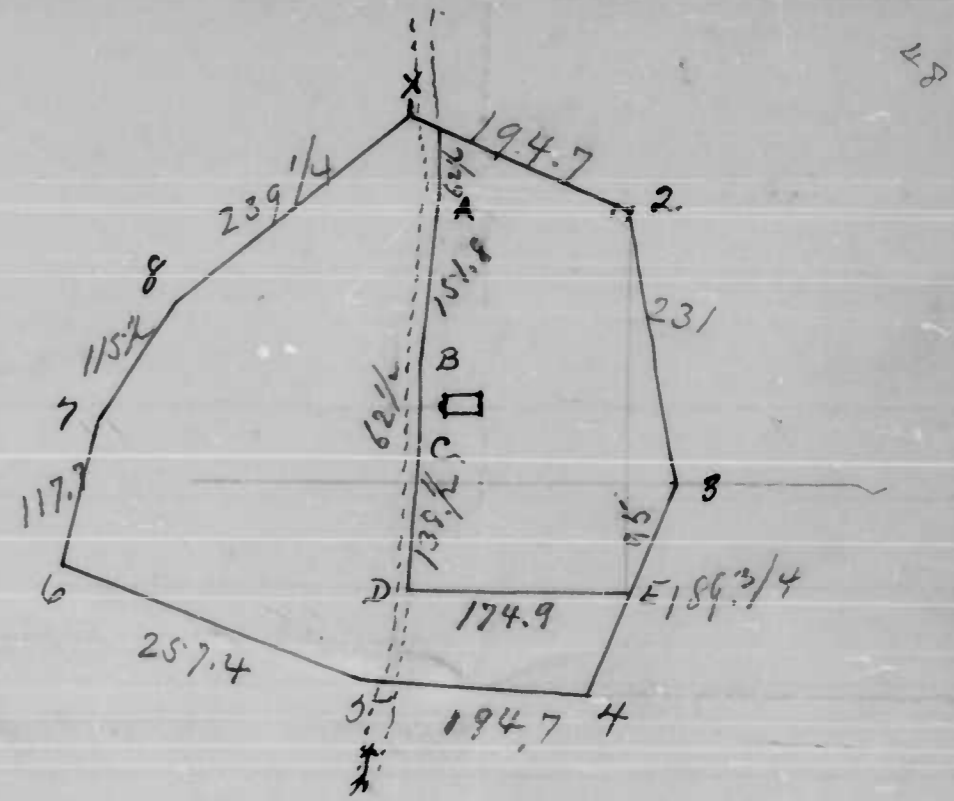

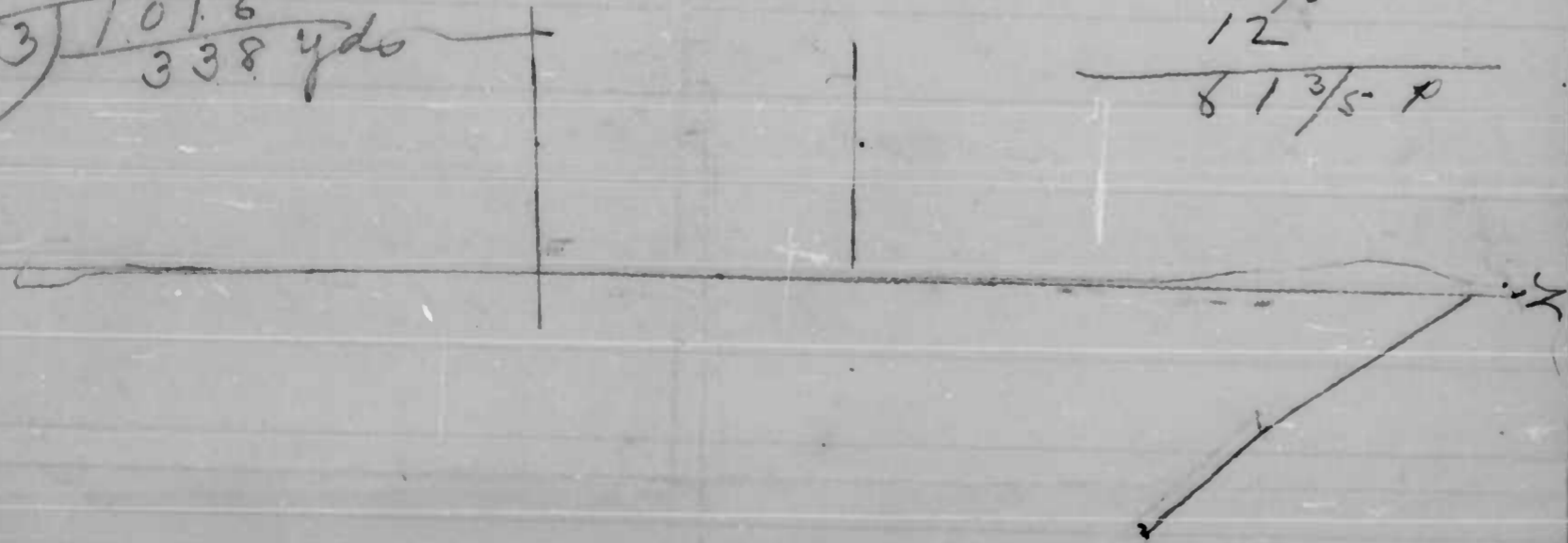
