

- Page 251, line 14. "Pend." Apparently "Gent."
- Page 252, line 7. "Cook" or "Cooke" here and elsewhere for "Coke."
- Page 252, line 11. "will" for "writt."
- Page 253, line 10. "fitz hert," *i. e.* Fitzherbert.
- Page 253, line 27. "respected" for "respited."
- Page 258, line 43. "spās," *i. e.* subpoenas.
- Page 260, line 37. "presence at the ken," *sic.* Perhaps "prisoner at the bar."
- Page 261, line 4. "sped," *i. e.* subpoenaed.
- Page 261, line 24. "imployed Molline." Perhaps "implied malice."
- Page 298, line 14. "Defensoris" for "Defensores."
- Page 317, line 68. "coquets" or "cockets": custom-house receipts.
- Page 326, line 18. "do" for "so."
- Page 343, line 44. "Indians and did." Something apparently omitted.
- Page 349, line 14. "naked Indians." The Algonkin tribes in alliance with the French were so designated.
- Page 363. Several of these names are undecipherable.
- Page 395, line 13. "Revolution." The words "is unrecorded" seem wanting.
- Page 396, line 28. "fint," *sic.* Perhaps "first."
- Page 399, line 7. "Caspany" for "Çasparus."
- Page 399, line 10. "Lomas" for "Lomax."
- Page 421, line 23. "answered." Probably "assessed."
- Page 421, line 44. "forte and after." The act reads "a deck flush fore and aft."
- Page 423, line 12. "natura" for "naturae."
- Page 456, line 34. "Chancery." "writts" omitted.
- Page 459, line 1. "Mons' Casteene." The Baron de Castin who had married the daughter of a Penobscot chief, and took part in various expeditions against the English, but not in the capture of Schenectady.
- Page 459, line 3. "Skinnelicot" for "Schenectady."
- Page 460, line 41. "sister a" for "sister of."
- Page 469, line 19. The scribe has inadvertently written 1737 for 1692. This shows in what year this copy was made.
- Page 482, line 45. "comīzan" for "cognizance."
- Page 483, line 16. So indorsed, though it is really a citation.
- Page 485, line 46. "Protstants," *i. e.* Lukc and Burnct, who signed the protest.
- Page 487, line 32. The copy in Lib. K is not identical with that sent to England, so both are given.
- Page 502, line 1. "honest man," *i. e.* Jacobite.
- Page 507, line 43. "cer retur," *i. e.* certificate returnable.
- Page 519, line 28. The P. R. O. copy of this letter is better than that in Lib. K.
