Sir

Being an entire Stranger to the Inhabitants of your State, and under the necessity of appointing a deputy Commissary General of Prisoners for Maryland, I am obliged to trouble your Excellency in asking the nomination of a proper Person to execute that office, who shall receive his Appointment without delay.

As I find fort Frederick is to be fitted up, for the reception of Prisoners; I should be glad if he was acquainted with that part of the Country, altho' I do not think it absolutely necessary. He must be a man of Character, Integrity & Activity, yet the Business will not require but a small part of his Time

His Pay & Rations will be that of a Major in the Army of the United States. As soon as a proper Person is fixed on & accepts the Office, I should be glad he would make me a return of all the Prisoners of War in the State, with their Corps, Time when & Place where taken. He can forward it to me at head Quarters. I have the Honor to be with great Esteem
