By the Councill March 3<sup>d</sup> 1685:

The fine assessed upon the pet<sup>r</sup> is hereby wholly remitted as to his L<sup>sps</sup> part thereof, and therefore Ordered that all further suite or prosecution against him in that behalf doe cease.

Returne made of an ord<sup>r</sup> of this board directed to the hon<sup>ble</sup> Coll W<sup>m</sup> Stevens and Majo<sup>r</sup> Thomas Taillor together with one Christopher Nutter Interpreter the 30<sup>th</sup> day of Septemb<sup>r</sup> last past for the retreive of two Indians subjects to the Empero<sup>r</sup> of Nantecoke committed for the murd<sup>r</sup> of one Griffin Evans late Servant of M<sup>r</sup> Daniel Clarke the s<sup>d</sup> two Indians haveing broke loose and made their Escape viz:

## Dorchester ss:

By vertue of Instructions to us directed by the honble Councill dated the thirteenth day of Septemb 1685 to treate with the Emperour of Nantecoke concerning One Sampson an Indian, which was delivered up by Nicodepeto the Emperours P. 312 Sonn for Killing one Griffith Evans late Servant to Mr Daniel Clark of Dorchester County, and since have broken prison and made his Escape In obedience to the said Instructions Wee did upon the last day of this instant moneth of November meete at Nantecoke in ordr to treate with the said Emperour, but findeing the sd Emperor absent, and a greate distance off as farr as the Whorekill, sent for Nicodepeto the Emperor Sonn, and treated with him in pursuance to the said Instructions, demanding the Indian prisoner that did make his Escape, and his answer was that he would be very diligent in appre-
