Sheweth that the sd Ship upon the 30th day of Pet. of Richd Bass December last was Seized by Thomas Collyer an Whitehall abt Ship Officer und yo' Exncy and that by information of one Charles of Gabriell Parrot that She has brought in some goods Topsham contrary to Act of Parliamt as alsoe (being an unfree bottom) that She is uncapable of Trading into this Province; the former of weh allegacons is Utterly ffalse; and the latter as yo' Peticon' is advised, and is ready to make appear, in no wise Sufficient to give yor Peticon this molestation.

That yo' Petition' lyes at great Charge, and if his sd Ship be not brought to a Speedy Tryall for the sd Supposed breaches, shall loose the opportunity of Sayling with the Convoy whereby not only yor Petitionrs Owners will be considerable loosers but likewise his Maty loose at least the Sume of 4000¹¹ Sterl. w^{ch} will be his due for Custom upon

Landing her loading in Engl. wherefore

Yor Peticon humbly Prays that in Consideracon of the Prmises yor Exncy out of yor wonted goodness, and tenderness to Traders as well as out of yor Zeal for promoteing his Matys interest will please to Appoint Speciall Commissionrs and that with all the Speed yor Exacy Can with Convenience for Tryall of the sd Supposed Breaches, that yor Peticon may know the issue of the matter;
