If you have any Pork packed away, it will save some Trouble to send it by this Boat on her Return write us at what Time we may send for a Boat Load. We do not consider ourselves at Liberty to change the Bills which have been received of the Emissions called in; if it was to the Extent of a few thousand Pounds only, it would not be a Matter of any great Consequence to the Public, but if we should take back all of those Emissions that have been paid away, it is very likely our Treasury would be so far impoverished as not to be able to supply Money for the current Expences.
