Ordered that the Commissary of Stores deliver to John Mason a nine Months Soldier in the 5<sup>th</sup> Reg<sup>t</sup> Discharged, the Amo<sup>t</sup> of Twenty three Pounds ten shillings in Cloathing & 1 Blanket, Henry Crane a 9 M<sup>o</sup> Sold<sup>r</sup> in the 7<sup>th</sup> Reg<sup>t</sup> Disch<sup>d</sup> the am<sup>t</sup> of Twenty one Pounds, three shillings & six Pence in Cloathing and 1 Blanket, & Isaac Green a 9 Mo<sup>o</sup> Sold<sup>r</sup> in the 3<sup>d</sup> Reg<sup>t</sup> Discharged the amount of Eleven Pounds, fifteen shillings & six Pence in Cloathing due them by an Act of Assembly to procure Troops for the American Army.

That the western shore Treasurer pay to Philemon Griffith one hundred & thirty six Pounds, seventeen shillings & six pence for the use of Sam<sup>l</sup> Griffith per Acc<sup>t</sup> passed by the Aud<sup>t</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup>
