We were mistaken as to the Johnson's being Gunned, her Guns are not mounted tho' we have Carriages for the large Guns. These two Gallies are now at Indian Landing if a Force can be had from Baltimore to carry them thither we shall willingly let them go and take the Chance of manning them we will also be glad to have
