p. 9 The Petition of M<sup>r</sup> John Gresham Jun<sup>r</sup> Late Sherriffe of  
 Anne Arund<sup>l</sup> County M<sup>r</sup> Tho<sup>s</sup> Bordley C<sup>lk</sup> and Moses Adney  
 Cryer of the late Speciall Court read praying an Allowance  
 of Fees to be made them proportionable to their respective  
 Services in that Court, being read. Ordered that the Petition-  
 ers have & receive from the several persons accused such fees  
 in respect of the Several Services by them done and per-  
 formed, as are taken & Allowed in the Provinciall Court.

The Petition of the Inhabitants of the Towne and Porte of  
 Annapolis read praying the Generall Assemblies Consideration  
 of their greate Loss in the Platt of the Towne being burnt in  
 the Court House and that they would be pleased to order the  
 Towne to be resurveyed at the Publick Charge. Which by  
 this Boarde was thought but reasonable and recom<sup>m</sup>ended to  
 the House of Delegates for their Concurrence thereto.
