By the Council in Assembly October the 25th 1711

Since we have so often lett you know we cannot advise the Presid^t to act any thing contrary to her Majesty's Instructions we admire you should now insist upon Regulating the Act for limiting Officers Fees having formerly agreed to refer that Matter to the Arrival of a Cap^t Gen¹ which as it cannot be Expected will be long so It will also be the most proper and convenient time to Settle those fees. And therefore we propose that the Law be reenacted as heretofore least for want thereof the officers be obliged to prosecute Actions for their Fees to the great oppression of the good People of the Province

We cannot consent to any regulation of that Law at this Time & therefore think it will be to no purpose to spend time in Conference thereon
