November the 7th 1712

Upon receipt of your message yesterday relating to the Arms and Ammunition and building Magazine Houses in each County this House took the same into Consideration and maturely debated the same And upon the Question put whether such Houses are necessary and Convenient to be built or not It passed in the negative. The House thereupon resolved that the Arms and Ammunition remain in the Hands of the Several Commanders of each County to whom the same hath been committed until the next Session of Assembly

This House have also ordered that M^r Philemon Hemsley who intermarried with Col Contee's Widow shall the next Assembly lay before this House the Account of what Arms and Ammunition were lodged in Col Contee's Hands for the use of the Publick and how the same have since been disposed of
