

One other Act, entitled:

- An Act for rectifying the ill Practice of Attorneys of this Province, and ascertaining the Attorney-General and Clerk of Indictments Fees. Bacon
- An Act for securing Merchants (and Others) Tobacco, after they have received it.
- An Act for the Directions for the Sheriffs Office in this Province, and for the more easy Payment of the Public and County Levies.
- An Act for the Appointment of Constables, and what relates to their Office.
- An Act relating to Servants and Slaves.
- An Act ascertaining the Height of Fences, to prevent the Evil occasioned by the Multitude of Horses, and restraining Horse-Rangers within this Province.
- An Act relating to the Standard of English Weights and Measures.
- An Act for the taking Special Bail in the several Counties of this Province, upon Actions and Suits depending in his Majesty's Provincial Court.
- An Act for the speedy Trial of Criminals, and ascertaining their Punishments in the County Courts when prosecuted there.
- An Act for Quieting of Possessions, Enrolling Conveyances, and Securing the Estates of Purchasers.
- An Act providing what shall be good Evidence to prove Foreign and other Debts; and to prevent vexatious and unnecessary Suits at Law, and pleading Discount in Bar.
- An Act prohibiting all Masters of Ships or Vessels, or any other Persons from transporting or conveying away any Person or Persons out of this Province without Passes.
- An Act for the better Administration of Justice in Probate of Wills, and granting Administrations, recovery of Legacies, and securing Filial Portions.
- An Act imposing Three-pence per Gallon on Rum and Wine, Brandy and Spirits, and Twenty Shillings per Poll for Negroes, for raising a Supply to defray the Public Charge of this Province; and Twenty shillings per Poll on Irish Servants, to prevent the Importing too great a Number of Irish Papists into this Province, made at a Session of Assembly begun and held at the Town and Port of Annapolis, the Fifth Day of September, Annoq. Domini 1704.
