It appearing to this house that Paper and Parchment is wanting for the use of the Publick, and as there is a Ballance, remaining in the hands of the Executors of Col Samuel Young of £13..16..8 in Current Gold due on the Duty of Twenty shillings sterling ꝑ head on Irish Papists and Negroes imported into this Province, We propose that that Ballance be taken out of the said Executors hands by
p. 154 an Order drawn on them payable to M^r Philip Hammond, who has undertaken to convert that Sum into a Bill of Exchange and send to England for Paper and Parchment for the Use of the Publick to the Amount thereof if Your Honours concurr therewith
