Upon having Recourse to the last Years Levy Lists, returned to the Clerk of the Council, for Ten Counties only, (The Returns from the Counties of Frederic, St Marys, Worcester, and Queen Ann's not having yet been made,) we find the Amount of the Poor's Rate, therein, including Sheriffs Commission, to be One Million Three hundred Seven Thousand Six hund.d and forty two Pounds of Tobacco. Whether the Erection of Work-houses or Houses of Correction, in all the Counties, would not give great Relief to the Inhabitants in the annual Levies, afford a more regular and better applied Provision for the Poor, check the Disorders committed by p. 221 common Beggars & idle Vagabonds, and lay a Foundation for useful Industry, we refer to your Consideration.
