James Meager and Mark H. Irvine formerly Subjects of the King of Great Britain appeared before the Board and voluntarily made, repeated and subscribed a Declaration of their belief in the Christian [p 21] Religion, and also took, repeated and subscribed the Oath prescribed by the "Act for Naturalization" wherefore they are now become Subjects of this State.
