Llewelin Barry of Baltimore County by his Petition to the Board sets forth that he was presented at January Term last in two Presentments for selling liquors without licence, and fined by the Justices of Baltimore County Court of Oyer and Terminer and Goal delivery the sum of Six hundred pounds of Tobacco on each which also appears by a transcript of the Proceedings of the Court against him, that he is unable to pay the said fines without distressing his family he therefore prays a remission, and three of the Justices of the said Court having from inability to pay the fines and his good Character [p. 45] recommended a remission thereof, the Board in consideration of all the Circumstances of his case do order and direct that the said two fines of Six hundred pounds of Tobacco each, be remitted on his paying all the Costs arising on the said Presentments.
