FURTHER AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

By Mr. Moses,

At the end of Code section 49, add the following:

“Provided, That one-half of the license fees derived hereunder from the license fees required to be paid on the stock of goods over \$40,000, shall be paid into the Treasury of the City of Baltimore, where said licenses are issued in the city of Baltimore.”

Which proposed amendment was rejected, and

The bill was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
