Joint Resolution that the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House, jointly, shall name and appoint a commission, to consist of five discreet persons, residing in Baltimore city, which commission shall have the power to discharge the duties hereinafter mentioned, and shall, by a full and thorough investigation, ascertain the cost of the present property, plant and appliances now used in the supply of gas to the city of Baltimore, acquiring right of way and easements, the amount expended in constructing the same, and the equipment of the works now owned by the Consolidated Gas Company, as well as other expenditures and investments, the cost of production and delivery of gas at the burners.

Mr. Bryan moved that the Joint Resolutions be substituted for the unfavorable report.
