THE PRESIDENT: Delegate Pullen.

DELEGATE PULLEN: Thank you. I just wanted to get it on the record.

THE PRESIDENT: Delegate Case.

DELEGATE CASE: Mr. Chairman, this may not really be the time to ask this question, but following up the point I made earlier, namely that the Commission on State Finance and Taxation felt it was important as a matter of substance to have in the Constitution a section which dealt merely with the right of the counties to receive taxing powers or the right of municipalities to receive taxing powers so that anybody who was interested in this subject could find it indexed and could go right to it, in view of the fact that this has been taken out, or this has been emasculated by your committee and filtered into the local government section, I am wondering whether or not, and I am posing this question to the President of the Convention, whether or not this really isn't a substantive change.

THE PRESIDENT: Delegate Case, the change made in 7.04 is not a substantive change, because the Committee on Local Government had in the predecessor of this section
