2 DELEGATE JAMES: Does Delegate Boyer yield?

3 DELEGATE BOYER: Gladly.

4 DELEGATE MARION: Delegate Boyer, I was one
5 concerned about this entire sentence when we went over this
6 in the Committee on Style, and I am particularly bothered
7 by the word "proposal," where we speak of something in
8 a different context than "amendment" in this last sentence.

9 I wonder this: If the sentence reads the
10 way it originally came from your committee as the Needle
11 amendment would change it if adopted right now, would that
12 carry about it the command of section 10.02 that an
13 amendment to the Constitution proposed by a Constitutional
14 Convention must be proposed by the affirmative vote of a
15 majority of all of the members of that Convention?

16 In other words, is "proposal recommended for
17 changing the Constitution" in section 10.03 the same as
18 "amendment" in section 10.02, so that it is proposed only by
19 a majority vote; or is this intended to be silent on the
20 manner in which any proposal is to be submitted to the
21 voters by that Constitutional Convention, and the majority
